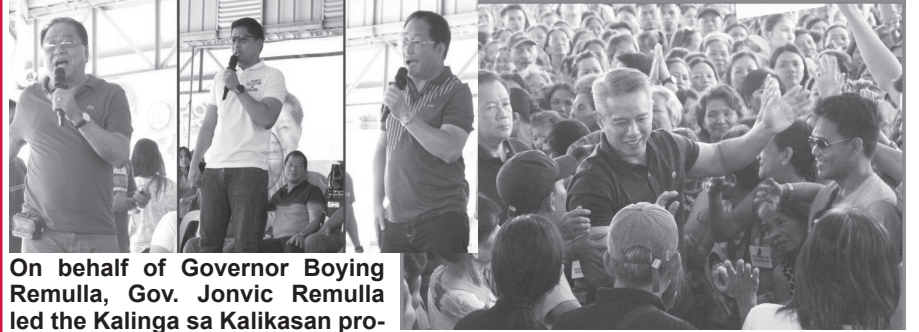

EDITORIAL: Setting an example

The Commission on Elections has ordered administration candidates for senator to take down the oversize campaign materials featuring PDP-Laban party bets in an electronic billboard on a condominium building along EDSA or face charges for violating election laws.

In a series of Twitter posts, Comelec Commissioner Rowena Guanzon said the poll body issued the warning in response to online criticism of the billboards featuring Maguindanao Rep. Dong Mangudatu, former Philippine National Police Chief Ronald dela Rosa, former special assistant to the president Christopher Go, Senator Aquilino Pimentel III and former presidential adviser for political affairs Francis Tolentino, all senatorial bets of the ruling PDP-Laban party.

"These oversize campaign materials on electronic billboards are prohibited," Guanzon said in her tweet, saying that "by public demand, candidates Bong Go and Tolentino please take down your posters now." Two days ago, Comelec spokesman James Jimenez also tweeted photos of Go's campaign posters along Quezon Avenue.

"These posters are of the right size, but the location is wrong," Jimenez tweeted. The statements citing campaign violations by the administration candidates are welcome, coming from a poll

agency that is often perceived as being too lenient, particularly when it comes to applying the rules to the party in power. But good governance doesn't begin and end with Twitter posts, and calling out the candidates just isn't enough. If its warnings are to be taken seriously, the Comelec needs to ensure that follow-up actions are taken in a timely manner, and that the offending campaign materials are indeed removed, or, if they are not, that the appropriate sanctions under the law are imposed. Finally, it must also publicize these actions as an example to all others who violate campaign laws. Of course, it isn't only the Comelec that needs to set an example.

Candidates who aspire to become lawmakers must first show they know how to respect the law. It isn't enough for these candidates to claim that the illegal campaign materials were put up by unnamed supporters without their knowledge or approval. Nor is it enough that they issue a public statement pleading with these followers to take down the posters. What they must do is prove their sincerity and ability to follow the rules by having their staff remove the offending materials wherever they are found and reported.

After all, if they cannot follow the rules, what gives them the right to set them for everybody else?

TOP AIDE OF FORMER MAYOR, ABDUCTED IN LAGUNA

Camp Vicente Lim, Laguna - The top aide of late Tanauan City Mayor Antonio Halili was abducted in Sta Rosa City Wednesday night.

The victim was identified as Allan Fajardo, former head of the disbanded Mayor's Action Group of Tanauan City serving under Halili.

Fajardo was with Ricky Atienza and were having dinner at Misto Restaurant inside SEDA Hotel in Nuvali at Barangay Sto Domingo, Sta Rosa City when a group of unidentified suspects entered and forcibly abducted the two victims.

They were heard to a white van then fled towards unknown direction.

In August 2018, a month after Mayor Halili was assassinated while attending a flag raising ceremony at Tanauan City Hall, Fajardo asked the Philippine National Police to conduct an investigation on himself on allegations that he was involved in illegal activities in Calabarzon.

In a letter addressed to PNP Director-General Oscar Abayalde, Fajardo said that he is a legitimate businessman in Batangas and this can be verified by reputable citizens of the said province.

According to a letter signed by Atty. Ferdinand Topacio and Atty. Joseli-

to Lomangaya, Fajardo's counsels, their client is a victim of a disinformation campaign where Fajardo was being named as the leader of a criminal syndicate allegedly called the 'Fajardo Group,' which is supposedly involved in guns-for-hire and illegal drugs.

Fajardo alleged that certain police officials have formulated a matrix which appear to show the members of the said group, and he himself has been the subject of harassment such as the police searching his house and filing baseless charges against him.

But Fajardo said that all of the cases against him have already been dismissed by the courts and as of now, there is not one case pending against him in court. Worse, Fajardo added, two members whose names appear in the matrix have been killed under mysterious circumstances.

Fajardo vehemently denied that he is involved in any illegal activities, and added that as head of the 'Mayor's Anti-Crime Group,' or MAC-G in Tanauan, Batangas, he was directly responsible for the arrest of many criminals, including drug pushers.

To electric coops: Nix partisan political activity

Senator Win Gatchalian reminded electric cooperatives (ECs) to remain apolitical at all times and avoid participating in any partisan political activity during the election period.

Gatchalian, chair of the Senate Committee on Energy, made the call after the National Association of Electricity Consumers for Reforms, Inc. (NASECORE) accused some ECs of making financial and other contributions to party-list groups and personalities vying for seats in this year's elections.

The lawmaker said if the allegations are indeed true, the ECs involved may be violating a provision of the Omnibus Election Code, which forbids public utilities and those granted franchises by the government, such as elec-

tric cooperatives, from making any contributions for political purposes.

"It is alarming to learn that there are some electric cooperatives that have been contributing to the campaign kitties of party-list groups. By funding political groups, they have prejudiced consumers because the money could have been used for the improvement of their facilities or other electrification initiatives," Gatchalian said.

"There is also the question of where the money came from. Because ECs are non-profit, they have an obligation to show that they are not using consumers' contributions for political activities," he added.

Gatchalian said that as chair of the Senate Committee on Energy, he was inclined to look into the allegations and hold erring electric cooperatives accountable. In a letter dated March 5, 2019, NASECORE urged the Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC) to conduct a regulatory audit on electric cooperatives as the group ac-

cused some distribution utilities of bankrolling the election campaign of the Philippine Rural Electric Cooperatives Association, Inc. (PHILRECA) Party-list.

The group claimed that Davao del Sur Electric Cooperative (DASURECO) made a ₱3-million contribution to PHILRECA party-list while Isabela II Electric Cooperative (ISELCO) chipped in another ₱2 million to the party-list group's campaign.

NASECORE argued that the two electric cooperatives violated not only the Energy Regulatory Commission-approved EC Annual Revenue Requirement (ARR), but also Section 95 (b) of the Omnibus Election Code. Section 95 (b) of the Omnibus Election Code states that "natural or juridical persons operating a public utility aren't allowed to make contributions

"for the purpose of partisan political activity." For this reason, NASECORE wants the ERC to immediately issue a directive to all electric cooperatives, ordering them not to use its funds, directly or indirectly, for the 2019 elections.

China loans ...

Finance Secretary Carlos Dominguez III has said some sectors that have continued to raise the false spectre of the Philippines defaulting on its concessional loans to China have no faith in their own country.

Dominguez said fears of the Philippines defaulting on any of its loans are unfounded, given that the government has never failed to pay its debts even during the worst of times.

"The Philippines has never, never defaulted on its loans. The Philippines has not done it even in the worst time and the worst time was right after Marcos," Dominguez said in a recent interview with reporters.

He said that even when the Philippines was cash-strapped, it had never defaulted on any of its loans, recalling that the country paid its obligations on the \$2.2 billion Bataan Nuclear Power Plant project despite it turning out to be a "white elephant."

"The Philippines has no history of defaulting on its loans. So why are people saying now that we will default? They have no faith in the Philippines? I don't know why people are saying 'There might be a default.' That means to say those people have no faith in their own country," Dominguez stressed.

Dominguez also said there is no collateral involved in the loans that the government has entered into with any country as he invited the public to examine the terms of all the loan accords that the Philippines has signed with its development partners, which are available for viewing at the Department of Finance (DOF) website, www.dof.gov.ph.

Even lawmakers have dismissed concerns about the Philippines defaulting on its loans and China seizing the country's public assets, with Senate Minority Leader Franklin Drilon pointing out that this will never happen, given that Presidential Decree 1177 mandates the automatic appropriations for debt servicing, which

means the Philippines will always have to pay its debts.

Dominguez earlier reassured the public that the Philippines will not fall into a "debt trap" to any country as the government expands its infrastructure investments through concessional loan financing from its development partners in the region.

He also reiterated that in conformity with the Constitution and our laws, none of the pipeline projects funded with official development assistance (ODA) from countries like Japan and China allow for the appropriation or takeover of domestic assets in the event of failure to pay, which is unlikely.

The government's borrowing program, Dominguez noted, remains "very conservative in the sense that we only borrow to invest in projects that will generate economic gains which are greater than the borrowing cost."

According to Dominguez, no infrastructure project is funded through ODA without going through a rigorous system of reviews and approvals by the Cabinet and the President, and unless there is certainty that the project is economically viable and highly beneficial for the Filipino people.

Dominguez said the government's debt is carefully structured to ensure that it does not borrow without raising its own capital for infrastructure projects, while at the same time sourcing a significant portion of financing from the local debt market to minimize exposure to adverse external factors.

He said that as of 2018, the government's project debt exposure was only 0.66 percent to China and 9 percent to Japan in relation to the total debt.

By 2022, when most of the financing for the "Build, Build, Build" program will have been accessed, the country's project debt to China will account for 4.5 percent, while that of Japan's will be twice as large

CLARK, PAMPANGA— Finance Secretary Carlos Dominguez III said here Wednesday the record speed by which the expansion project for the Clark International Airport is being implemented underlines the steadfast commitment and political will of the Duterte administration to fast-track its "Build, Build, Build" program and thereby unlock immediate gains for the Filipino people.

This airport expansion, which has thus far been the fastest infrastructure project implemented by the Duterte administration, sets the template for all other ventures under the "Build, Build, Build" program, Dominguez said.

Dominguez said that even if the government has adopted a "fast-and-sure" approach in implementing its infrastructure modernization projects, it is making sure that all contracts and bidding procedures for these were being done "with full transparency and accountability."

"This is not only a model for the rapid implementation of projects. It is also a model for effective governance in the modern age," Dominguez said here before the start of an inspection tour to check the progress of the work on the Clark airport expansion project.

The expansion of the Clark airport, which involves the construction of a new and bigger passenger terminal, is the first of the government's "hybrid" infrastructure projects under President Duterte's centerpiece initiative "Build, Build, Build."

The Clark International Airport is envisioned by the government as the country's next premier gateway that will help clear the congestion at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA) and anchor the rapid development

of New Clark City in Central Luzon. Dominguez said he expects New Clark City, which is being developed into the country's first smart, green and fully planned metropolis, "to become the investment center in Asia." In June 2017, the board of the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA) chaired by President Duterte approved the Clark airport expansion project after which it broke ground following a short period of six months.

Today, Dominguez said the passenger terminal is 56 percent complete and is expected to be done ahead of schedule by the middle of next year.

"The speed by which we have processed and implemented the long-overdue Clark International Airport project exemplifies this administration's commitment to ensure that our people reap the benefits of the 'Build, Build, Build' program as soon as possible," Dominguez said. "Some credit will have to be given to the political will to get things done."

In contrast, NAIA's rehabilitation, of which the original proponent status was granted to the NAIA Consortium in September last year, has not yet started, he said.

"People have to remember that when projects are delayed, the ones who suffer are the people. So it is not PPP, it should be PPPP--Public-Private Partnership for the People. And I think many people forget that the beneficiaries are really the public," Dominguez said.

He recalled that the expansion of the Clark airport has been on the planning stage for 20 years, but with every administration finding "every reason to prevent the project's execution." But under the Duterte administration, "the means and the methods were found to finally make things happen."

He added that translating the research outputs to technologies and products that can be used by the Filipino people is the priority of the Council.

Task Force draws up initial list of 138K foreign workers in POGOs, other industries

An interagency task force now checking the number of foreign nationals working for Philippine online gaming operators (POGOs) has come up with an initial list of 138,000 workers employed in these Internet-based operations as well as in other businesses, an apparently untapped subsector that could yield for the government an estimated P32 billion in additional income taxes annually.

In their report to Finance Secretary Carlos Dominguez III during a meeting Friday last week, the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) and the Bureau of Immigration (BI) came up with a reconciled list of 138,001 workers, of which 54,241 were issued alien employment permits (AEPs) and another 83,760 granted special working permits (SWPs).

Assuming that each foreign national is earning an average of \$1,500 a month and taxed at 25 percent of his or her gross income, Dominguez came up with a rough calculation of P32 billion a year in income taxes to be collected from these workers.

Dominguez said he noticed that

the names in the submitted list have no Taxpayer Identification Numbers (TINs) and their corresponding salaries reported was only around P20,000 each per month, which was "ridiculously low" for skilled foreign workers for POGOs.

Deputy Commissioner Arnel Guballa of the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) said the agency will start working on the list to check how many years these workers have been here in the country and whether they have paid taxes for the last two taxable years.

Guballa said the Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corp. (PAGCOR) has so far submitted a list of 126 out of 205 POGOs, which employ a total of 53,239 foreign workers with an average salary of about P41,000 each.

Victor Padilla, PAGCOR's senior manager of its policy division, offshore gaming licensing department, said penalties and demerits will be issued to those that have yet to comply with the requirement for them to submit the lists of their respective foreign workers.

PAGCOR will seize the operations of

those that remain non-compliant despite repeated warnings, he said.

Guballa said during the meeting that other agencies such as the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) submitted the names of 52 foreign workers mostly in the construction sector; the Philippine Regulation Commission (PRC) sent a list of 75 foreign workers; while the Clark Development Corp. (CDC), reported 2,463 foreign workers employed at the Clark and Subic special economic zones (SEZs).

The Philippine Economic Zone Authority (PEZA) and the SEZs in Bataan, Aurora and in other locations all failed to submit their respective lists, Guballa said.

"What you have to do now is to reconcile the entire list. The maximum we know is 138,000. I have a suspicion that this figure is low," Dominguez said.

He asked the concerned agencies such as the DOLE and the Bureau of Immigration (BI) to find ways to reconcile the list by physically checking the establishments where these foreign workers have been hired. "En-

force the law so we can collect the tax," Dominguez said.

Labor Secretary Silvestre Bello III, who heads the interagency task force, said the DOLE currently only has 800 law compliance officers (LCOs) to do the job of checking the establishments. He said the DOLE needs 5,000 LCOs.

To ensure that foreign workers comply with tax laws, the BI said their visas will not be renewed unless they submit proof of their income tax payments.

But Dominguez said this will only apply to workers with valid work permits and does not cover those without proper documentation. Hence, the need to physically check establishments for compliance, he added.

BIR Com-

missioner Caesar Dulay said one way to track down foreign workers is for the bureau to get a list of corporations and immediately audit them.

Guballa said they will check both the companies paying the salaries of foreign nationals and countercheck these with their respective lists of employees.

The Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), for its part, said that registered companies with foreign hires, particularly gambling firms, will be reported to the BIR and DOLE.

"We have all the data, we just have to put it all together," Dominguez said.

Dominguez said he expects the task force to come up with a cleaned-up, reconciled list in 30 days, which is in time for their next meeting.

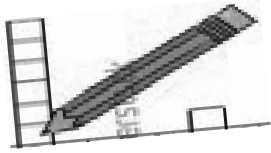

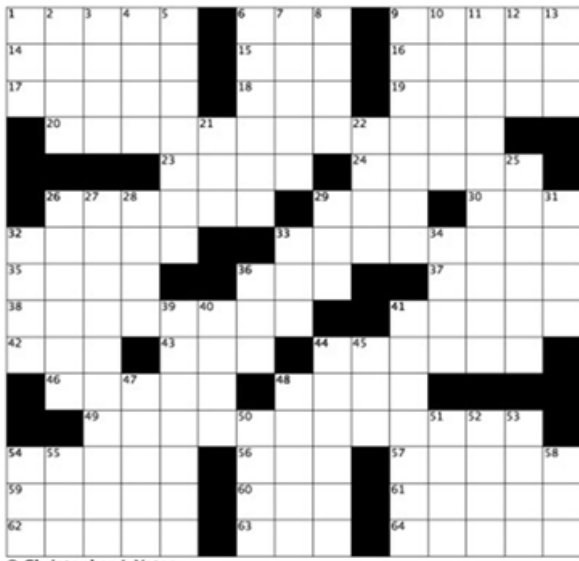

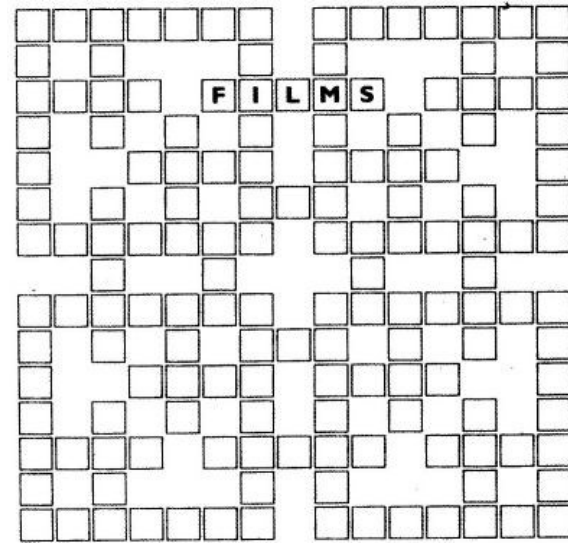

He motivated the students to continue acquiring knowledge to be financially independent in the future. "Education is an equalizer and students always have their chance to succeed in life. Grab it. Do not be satisfied on your present situation", he emphasized.

The mayor also expressed his gratefulness to all the stakeholders who have imparted skills and information to the students which they can use in the real world.

As for the city government's commitment to better education, he announced the planned establishment of additional Luis Ferrer Jr. Senior High School branch at Sta. Clara-Pinagtipunan and Biklatan area.

Sixth District Board Members Kerby Salazar and Felix "Jango" Grepo also conveyed their messages to the students and the public/private partners reflecting their eagerness to support the youth of Cavite.

Selected graduating senior high school students also shared their work immersion experience while the impression of work immersion was delivered by the representative of a partner office from the city government of Gen. Trias. (Gina Perlado Pereña)
