EDITORYAL: Satisfaction

Eight in 10 Filipinos say they are satisfied with the way President Rodrigo Duterte does his job.

The President also enjoys a +68 net satisfaction rating, a figure even higher than his previous record of +66 in March 2019 and June 2017. This is the latest finding by polling firm Social Weather Stations, which conducted the survey among 1,200 Filipinos between June 22 and June 26, a few days before the President crossed the halfway mark in his term

The survey period also coincided with the controversy over the Palace's response to the sinking of a Filipino boat by a Chinese vessel. On June 9 Chinese fishermen left 22 Filipinos in the water after the latter's boat had sunk. This has prompted outrage against the Chinese and frustration among the President's critics over how he appeared to favor our giant neighbor, much to the detriment of our own fishermen.

Palace officials cheered the survey results. Presidential Spokesman Salvador Panelo said that Mr. Duterte only becomes trusted and admired the more his critics hit him with dirt.

Indeed the President's continued surging popularity is unprecedented. Usually, by the time a president crosses the halfway mark of his or her term, the honeymoon period has long gone. It is no longer an issue of adulation or popularity but of survival, as a result of actions or omissions, or scandals that the leader may be embroiled in.

Evidently, Mr. Duterte is different. From the beginning, he has been a game-changer, upending the carefully plotted political plans of his opponents in 2016 and emerging as the dark horse in the race. He breaks out of the mold of his clean-shaven. elite-educated, proper-speaking, politically correct predecessors.

Fed up with this kind, the people continue to root for Mr. Duterte, who they claim remains effective despite-or because of-the rough edges to his personality.

But the still-surging ratings must be seen as a challenge rather than an opportunity to gloat. It's a feat, indeed, to enjoy this level of support from the public amid the numerous issues that hound the Duterte administration.

The President and his alter egos must never squander this sacred trust. They must act only in the faithful service of the nation. Satisfaction, after all, is a relative judgment that says people are all right with how the President performs his job-not objective proof that he is doing it as he should

Sen. Cynthia Villar has filed a bill that will help small farmers to quickly recover from the damage brought about by natural calamities, plant diseases and pest infestations.

Senate Bill 140 or the Free Index-Based Agriculture Insurance Act establishes the enabling policy, regulatory, and funding support for a more effective crop insurance program.

"With an average of 20 typhoons a year entering the country and 2 to 4 typhoons forecast to enter the country this July alone, there is an urgent need to further increase the access by our rice, corn and coconut farmers to safety nets against the effects of climate change and extreme weather risks," Villar said.

Villar, who is expected to continue to lead the

Villar files bill enabling small farmers to recover from typhoon damage

Committee on Agriculture and Food in the 18th Congress, noted that the Philippine Crop Insurance Corporation (PCIC) has too few participants and cannot cover all the farmers in need of their services.

In 2018, PCIC paid a total of P3.397 billion for damages to crops and properties. It also provided insurance cover to some 2.27 million farmers and fisherfolks. Assets covered included mostly rice, corn and high-value crop farms totalling 1.84 million hectares.

"When a farmer gets hit by a calamity, we want him to remain resilient. We want our farmer to get back within one week to the field to produce, support the country's food security and not fall into the poverty trap. This target of speedy but transparent payout has been made possible through the adoption of the innovative index-based insurance technologies," Villar said.

To subsidize the free premiums of farmers under the program, P6 billion shall be set aside from the current year's unprogrammed Risk Management Fund to potentially cover 2.8 million hectares of rice lands

"To effectively reach and serve more of the country's 6 million small-hold farmers who are most vulnerable to the impact of climate change, there is a need to involve the private sector and adopt a more relevant strategy and also safeguard the food security of the broader rural population," Villar said.

Villar also noted that weather index-based crop insurance has become a very popular mode providing risk transfer on the part of millions of farmers in Asia, Africa and Latin America.

Weather Index-based Crop Insurance requires strong collaboration among the meteorological agency and/or satellite-based weather monitoring services; agriculture research institutions; insurance service providers; local government units and farmers.

The bill also creates the Climate Risk Mitigation Fund for Small Farmers where any and all unutilized amounts under the program for any given year shall be placed. This fund may be used to further enhance index-based crop insurance in the country.

plans of 'putting up same centers in the barangay level targeting around 35 barangays as pilot for the Negosyo Serbisyo sa Barangay program.'



Customs collects P5.9-B so far in taxes from liberalized rice imports partment of Finance (DOF

The government has so far collected P5.9 billion in tariffs from some 1.43 million metric tons (MT) of rice stocks imported by private traders, following the enactment of a law in March that liberalized the importation of the grain, preliminary data from the Bureau of Customs (BOC) showed.

A report to Finance Secretary Carlos Dominguez III by Customs Commissioner Rey Leonardo Guerrero revealed that the BOC collected the highest amount of rice import tariffs from the Subic Bay port at P1.37 billion.

The Port of Manila collected P978.51 million in tariffs, followed by the Manila International Container Port with P942.76 million, said Guerrero during a recent De-

partment of Finance (DOF) Executive Committee meeting.

The Port of Cagayan de Oro collected P754.13 million in tariffs from rice imports, while the Port of Davao collected P703.93 million, preliminary BOC data show.

Republic Act (RA) No. 11203 or the Rice Liberalization Act was signed and approved by President Duterte last February 14.

Dominguez has described the rice liberalization law on the shift from quantitative restrictions (QRs) to tariffs on rice imports as a "proud" accomplishment of the Duterte presidency and the DOF, given that it took more than 30 years under various administrations to get the Congress to approve this game-changing reform.

Liberalizing rice imports, he said, will not only make quality rice more affordable and accessible to Filipino families, but will also lower the country's inflation rate, revolutionize the agriculture sector and help farmers become more productive and competitive in the global economy.

Dominguez said rice tariffication has proved to be challenging because it was "a politically difficult reform to pass."

Liberalizing rice imports has made the staple food more affordable to Filipinos, making retail prices this summer cheaper by P10 per kilo.

RA 11203 created the P10-billion Rice Competitiveness Enhancement Fund (RCEF) to help palay growers and their farmers' cooperatives transition to a new rice regime.

RCEF will be used to provide farmers tools and equipment, assistance in the production, promotion, and distribution of certified rice seeds, upgrading of post-harvest storage facilities, credit assistance, irrigation support, and research and development (R&D) support.

Section 13(c) of the rice tariffication law states that 10 percent of the P10-billion RCEF shall be made available in the form of credit facility with minimal interest rates and with minimum collateral requirements to rice farmers and cooperatives.

The rest of the RCEF will be set aside for rice farm machinery and equipment; rice seed development, propagation and promotion; and rice extension services, as provided under the law.

On top of paying tariffs, rice importers will be required to secure sanitary and phytosanitary import clearances (SPSIC) from the DA's Bureau of Plant Industry (BPI), which assumed the food safety regulation function of the National Food Authority (NFA) under the rice tariffication law.

This requirement will ensure that rice imports are free from pests and diseases that could affect public health and local farm production.

MICC to conduct 2nd round of audit of mining firms in July

The interagency Mining Industry Coordinating Council (MICC) is undertaking the second round of its "objective, science-based, and fact-finding" audit of mining operations in the fourth week of July, and expects such a review to be completed by January next year.

Finance Undersecretary Bayani Agabin said the second audit, which will cover 17 mining operations across the country, will be conducted by the same technical teams that undertook the first round of reviews last year covering 26 mines.

"The MICC will complete the review and management teams in the second and third week of July. We will tap around 15 experts from the same technical teams that did the first audit," said Agabin who chaired an MICC meeting held recently at the DOF main office in Manila.

Agabin said the

15 experts will be grouped into three teams with five members for each panel, and will have senior and junior technical and research assistants to help them with the audit.

The review will cover the environmental, economic, social, legal and technical aspects of the mining operations, he said.

Earlier, the MICC deferred a recommendation on the lifting of the moratorium on the issuance of new mineral agreements.

Executive Order (EO) 79 imposed a moratorium on new mineral agreements "until a legislation rationalizing existing revenue sharing schemes and mechanisms shall have taken effect".

The Tax Reform for Acceleration and Inclusion (TRAIN) Law or Republic Act No. 10963 increased the excise tax on mineral products from 2 percent to 4 percent.

DENR queried whether the increase would be considered as having satisfied the condition of a legislation rationalizing the existing revenue sharing scheme.

However, the DOF clarified that TRAIN only increased the excise taxes and did not cover the implementation of a new fiscal regime for mining. The new fiscal regime proposed by the DOF covers other taxes and fees, such as royalty, windfall, profit, and incentives.

Given the clarification, the MICC resolved to defer a recommendation to lift the moratorium on new mineral agreements, stressing that a revenue-sharing new scheme and mechanisms for mining will be covered in the Package 2 plus of the Comprehensive Tax Reform Program (CTRP), which will have to be refiled in the incoming 18th Congress.

Steps to develop human capital, attract FDIs top proposals in 2019's 1st Sulong Pilipinas

Initiatives to sharpen the competitiveness of the country's future workforce, improve the delivery of social services and attract more foreign direct investments (FDIs) top the list of "actionable" recommendations from the private sector during the first 'Sulong Pilipinas'

workshop held this year.

Presidential Communications Operations Office (PCOO) Secretary Martin Andanar, who received the recommendations on behalf of the Duterte administration during the recent workshop at the Philippine International Convention

Center (PICC) in Pasay City, said these inputs will continue to "help shape government direction in (its) crucial second half, as the administration redoubles its efforts to complete its human capital development and inclusive growth agenda."

According to Fi-

nance Assistant Secretary Antonio Joselito Lambino II, the No. 1 recommendation presented by the private sector during this year's first Sulong workshop at the PICC was the refinement of the K-12 basic education program through the skills enhancement of instructors and integration of in-demand skills in the curricula.

Landing at second and third places on the list were the promotion of water security through the rehabilitation of existing water dams and the creation of a Cabinet-level Department in charge of water resources management; and ensuring the effective implementation of the Ease of Doing Business (EODB) Law and appointment of the head of the Anti-Red Tape Authority (ARTA), Lambino said. 'Sulong Pilipinas'

is the annual consultative conference between the administration and the private sector. This year, participants from civil society, development partners, the academe, and vouth leaders engaged in workshops to produce 10 actionable recommendations, which have been effective in helping the government focus its efforts in implementing game-changing reforms.

Lambino has been a prime mover of 'Sulong Pilipinas' since it was first held in Davao City in June 2016 before then-Davao City Mayor Rodrigo Duterte took over as President.

Other recommendations on the list, ranked Nos. 4 to 6, were: making grants available to startups and enabling technology transfer to stimulate the growth of innovative digital startups; strengthening agricultural infrastructure and logistics to boost farm productivity; and amending the Magna Carta for micro, small and medium enterprises (MS-MEs), enacting the Warehouse Receipts Act and Weather-Indexed Agricultural Insurance plus accelerating efforts to address foreign shipping costs and port congestion.

The rest of the recommendations, ranked Nos. 7 to 10, were: ensuring strong agency performance by appointing competent technocrats as secretaries of key departments; enacting a modern and sustainable national policy in land and marine use; rehabilitating and upgrading major railways and airports to boost tourism; and amending the

Public Services Act, Right of Way (ROW) Act, and the economic provisions of the Constitution to fast-track infrastructure development, Lambino said.

The top 10 recommendations were presented by George Barcelon and Ma. Alegria Limjoco, chairman and president, respectively, of the Philippine Chamber of Commerce and Industry (PCCI), which has been a strategic partner of 'Sulong Pilipinas' since its inception.

"Even before the Duterte administration formally assumed office in 2016, Sulong was a demonstration of its willingness to listen," said Limjoco.

"In our experience, these workshops with the public have been complemented by decisive action on the part of government," Barcelon added.

receiving recommendations, Andanar reiterated the Duterte administration's "strong emphasis on the wider public's input in the crafting of public policy," as he pointed out that previous top recommendations from Sulong participants have led to thecrafting of multiple packages of the Comprehensive Tax Reform Program (CTRP); the implementation of the "Build, Build, Build" program; and enactment of the National ID system; the EODB Act; and the Universal Health Care (UHC) Law.

During the Sulong workshop, which was held after the Pre-State of the Nation Address (Pre-SONA) forum of the Economic Development and Infrastructure Clusters of the Duterte Cabinet, Finance Undersecretary Karl Kendrick Chua spoke about the progress the administration has made thus far in its socioeconomic agenda.

Chua reiterated the five key economic priorities for the second half of President Duterte's term, as discussed earlier that day by Finance Secretary Carlos Dominguez III.

These are: the accelerated implementation of "Build, Build, Build," the passage of the remaining CTRP packages; the pursuit of reforms related to the increase in FDIs and jobs; the improved implementation of reforms (e.g. Ease of Doing Business and rice tariffication); and the strengthening of farm productivity.

This provided context for workshop participants--they included representatives from business, civil society, the academe, and the youth-as they engaged in discussions to identify the top actionable recommendations for government, Lambino said.


Andanar said the administration "will press ahead with game-changing reforms and decisive government action" towards eradicating extreme poverty and building a prosperous society by 2040.

Held last July 1, the first in a series of Sulong workshops scheduled this year comes at the midterm of the Duterte administration. It is the 7th leg of the annual consultative forum, counting from the time it was first convened in 2016.

During the inaugural 'Sulong Pilipinas' in 2016, participants gave their inputs on the Duterte administration's Zero-to-10 Point Socioeconomic Reform Agenda, which helped deliver the CTRP, infrastructure modernization, national ID system; and the EODB Law. Lambino said.

Lambino said that the 2017 'Sulong Pilipinas' recommendations on ensuring accessible primary healthcare for every Filipino led to the passage of the UHC Law and a new tobacco tax reform measure to help finance UHC.

M e a n w h i l e , recommendations from Sulong 2018 on helping guide the administration's push for reforms in agriculture, led to the implementation of programs under the Rice Liberalization Act, Lambino said.





Mabalacat, Pampanga - Gardenia president Jun Umali highly assures Gardenia is bringing the future of breadmaking here in Central Luzon and excited to embrace the limitless possibilities in the North Luzon region as they officially open a completely new and automated bread plant in Pampanga.

Gardenia Bakeries inaugurates a fully-automated bread manufacturing facility inside TECO industrial estate in Mabalacat, Pampanga strategically situated near two major expressways, the North Luzon Expressway (NLEX) and the Subic-Clark-Tarlac Expressway (SCTEX). It offers an efficient trade and distribution gateway to the North Luzon region all the way to Ilocos and Cagayan Valley as well as Central Luzon provinces.

Umali explained the plant inauguration's theme 'Bake to the Future 2.0'. "For the first time in Gardenia's history in the Philippines, Gardenia Bakeries opens two huge factories with sophisticated technologies in a span of four months. This is truly a significant milestone for Gardenia in its 21 years in the Philippine bakerv industry." Umali stresses.

He also described how Gardenia applied the best technologies on its new production line. "The whole plant is computer-controlled starting from the use of an upgraded concept in the ingredient handling and makeup systems, proofing, use of robotics in handling baking pans and a unique technology in the depanning process which promises to be gentle to the bread, completely untouched by human hands," Umali said.

"The use of tumbler to check all four sides of the loaf bread and the presence of tornado cleaner to ensure all baking pans are clean and free of crumbs were also incorporated in the process," Umali added.

The oven baking system will continue to use environment-friendly liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) like in the other Gardenia factories.

Umali highlighted, "all equipment, machines and baking technologies are sourced from the best baking equipment suppliers from all over the world including Germany, the Netherlands, Japan and the USA. We also added new equipment suppliers that will enhance the whole baking process."

"The expertise in making advanced equipment from different sources operates as one integrated and a fully automated system is a pro-

prietary technical capability developed by Gardenia in its factories in Asia. This fusion of technology differentiates us from the competition," Umali asserted.

The sophisticated technology partnered with a proprietary manufacturing process and combined with premium and finest ingredients all contribute to the freshly - baked aroma, softness and delicious taste of world class Gardenia breads Filipinos love.

Umali also shared that the plant is designed to allow consumers to visit and witness the modern baking process through a catwalk plant tour especially for consumers from North Luzon.

Wide array of high quality breads

Umali further noted that the new plant will be Gardenia's second largest facility, next to its Laguna plant, "This new factory has a white loaf production line, a flavored loaf line, a bun and pandesal line and a snack toast line. With these four new production lines, the Pampanga factory will be able to produce nearly 400,000 loaves and buns every day ready for delivery to supermarkets, groceries and convenience stores," he said.

Vitabread Food Products Inc handles bread manufacturing for the North

and Central Luzon bread needs, and support Metro Manila markets; while Gardenia Bakeries Philippines ensures the marketing and distribution of finished Gardenia products. Tina Domondon, Vitabread General Manager, explained that wide selection of Gardenia products will be produced in the Pampanga bread facility, including white breads, health bread selections, flavored loaf offerings, buns or pandesal, and Neubake loaf and bread rolls.

Strategic bread factory location

The P 2-billion plant is located adjacent to major transportation hubs of Subic Sea Port, Clark International Airport and the newest business district, Clark Global City. Umali explained that the new [bread] plant is accessible for direct logistics connections, "All of our plants are strategically located. For instance, in case of breakdowns or natural disasters, our plant in Pampanga can supply Metro Manila up to South Luzon. Same is true for our bread factories in Cebu and Cagayan de Oro. Our Cagayan de Oro manufacturing facility can serve the Visayas market, or the Cebu plant can be a backup for the Mindanao plant, in case of unforeseen events.'

Meanwhile, Domondon revealed current logistics and distribution capabilities, "Gardenia is reaching Benguet, Ifugao, Mountain Province, Isabela, Kalinga and as far as Cagayan. With Vitabread in place, we will be able to reach even the smallest stores in these regions and nearby areas. Gardenia bread in every corner of the community, we will make it possible," she said. When asked about the pollution effect of the coal-fired power plant where TECO is one and the recent home of Gardenia in Central Luzon, Umali explained prior entering into contract with TECO, Gardenia Philippines visited the entire area within the plant to inspect any leak of emission the plant might exposed . Fortunately TECO is a compliant of all the permits needed to operate particularly the ECC from the DENR. And their location is almost 2km away from the TECO plant compound. Filipinos are now assured of increased and sufficient supply of freshly baked Gardenia products every day and especially during peak demand seasons like Christmas and New Year.

"As the market leader in the industry with more than 60% market share, we can contribute in ensuring food security and continuous supply of breads, not only during long weekends or when there are special occasions, but also even when there are typhoons, flooding or earthquakes," Umali asserted.

Umali also cited the importance of its logistics and distribution capabilities to ensure wider reach and market coverage. "As we bring our fresh, great-tasting quality products to more and more Filipinos, we will definitely expand our fleet of trucks all over Luzon and Metro Manila to distribute across various distribution channels," Umali said.

Gardenia's rapid sales growth makes it necessary to add more plant facilities to cater to the increasing bread demand in the Philippines.

"While we are a rice-eating country but due to lifestyle changes and increased health consciousness of Filipinos, bread consumption is growing," he explained. Umali added that the Philippines' consumption of bread per person is still lower compared to its neighbouring countries like Malaysia and Singapore, which is about three to five times more per capita. With increased supply and availability of quality and great-tasting bread, consumption is expected to grow faster.

Also Umali happily announced their office is willing to coordinate with government and non-government agencies when it comes to the aspect of their community social services.
