BACCOOR'S BEST: The Bacoor City Police Station was given two awards during the Oversight Committee Meeting of the Cavite Police Provincial Office on Anti-Illegal Drugs, Anti-Illegal Gambling, and E-MPO at Mayos Hall Camp BGen Pantaleon Garcia in Imus City, Cavite. It was named the Top Performing City Police Station on the campaign against loose firearms for conducting three operations that resulted in the arrest of eight personalities and confiscation of four loose firearms during the June 24 to 30, 2019 period. It was also named the Top Performing City Police Station on anti-illegal drugs operations for conducting 10 anti-illegal drug operations that resulted to the arrest of 33 drug personalities covering the June 25 to July 1, 2019 period.

EDITORIAL: No joking matter

We were gratified to learn that President Rodrigo Duterte has signed into law a measure penalizing cat-calling and other forms of harassment in public areas.

Under the final version of the Safe Spaces Act (RA 11213), principally authored by Senator Risa Hontiveros, persons arrested for cursing, wolf whistling, catcalling, and saying misogynistic, transphobic, homophobic, and sexist slurs for the first time will be fined ₱1,000 and will serve 12 hours in community service, which includes attendance at a gender sensitivity seminar. Second-time offenders will be jailed for six to 10 days or fined ₱3,000, while third-time offenders will be jailed 11 to 30 days and fined ₱10,000.

Penalties for making offensive body gestures and exposing private parts are at ₱10,000 for first-time offenders, and ₱15,000 along with jail time of 11 to 30 days for second-time offenders. Third-time offenders will be fined ₱20,000 and will be detained for a minimum of one month and a day up to six months.

Local government units are expected to pass corresponding anti-catcalling ordinances, and are required to have an anti-sexual harassment hotline.

The passage of the law seems particularly fitting, given that it has been signed by a President that has often

been criticized for being sexist and even misogynistic. Since taking office in June 2016, the President has ordered soldiers to shoot female rebels "in the vagina," kissed a married woman in the mouth in front of a crowd of overseas Filipino workers, and joked about raping a female missionary and Miss Universe.

Last year, at a forum with Indian and Filipino businessmen in New Delhi, the President said he wished he could promise investors "42 virgins" if they put up businesses in the Philippines, much like jihadists promise suicide bombers that 72 virgins await them in heaven if they die as martyrs. Thus far, Palace officials have played down the President's statements and actions as jokes or "playful gestures"—and insist that his critics are taking him too seriously.

But the new law that the President himself signed now makes no allowance for such "jokes" or "playful gestures." His apologists may no longer come back to us and say he was just joking.

We do hope the President will now set an example and follow the law.

But of course, he may still fall back on his presidential immunity from suit, which gives him carte blanche for another three years to tell the tasteless and sexist jokes we have come to expect.

MAGALLANES, Cavite - Alarmed by reports about the surge of dengue cases in some areas, the local government here embarked on a massive clean-up in possible dengue-carrying mosquito breeding sites and fumigation over the weekend.

Mayor Jasmin Maligaya-Bautista has ordered the Rural Health Unit (RHU), through its Municipal Health Officer Dr. Jose Jemmel Bacolod, to address the situation in view of eight dengue cases that were reported.

"I am calling on all our constituents to be on alert due to the rising dengue cases in our locality. Let us clean our surrounding especially in possible breeding sites of dengue carrier mosqui-

tos, and avoid mosquito bites)," she said in Filipino during the flag-raising ceremony Monday.

Bautista also directed the village chiefs of the 16 barangays, especially in Barangay Ramirez where the eight dengue cases were recorded, to coordinate with the municipal health office on ways to contain the situation.

Meanwhile, Bacolod also embarked on a massive information and education drive in the barangays for residents to be aware of the dengue symptoms.

The municipal health office also advised residents to never ignore symptoms like sudden high fever, severe headaches, pain behind the

eyes, severe joint and muscle pain, fatigue, vomiting, and skin rashes which appear two to five days after the onset of fever.

"If you experience these symptoms, kindly go to the nearest hospital for proper medical treatment," Bacolod said.

He said residents should be more careful because these are known to increase during the rainy season when stagnant water becomes the breeding sites for the dengue-carrying mosquitoes.

Bacolod said dengue could be fatal when unattended, as mosquito bites could transmit the infection, which triggers a severe flu-like illness often followed by a severe drop in a patient's blood platelet count. (PNA)

Senator Win Gatchalian wants to establish special education centers in all public schools in the country to promote inclusive education and enable schools to effectively handle the needs of children and youth with disabilities and other special needs.

In filing Senate Bill No. 171 or the Inclusive Education for Children and Youth with Special Needs Act, Gatchalian said the government needs to build upon the existing infrastructure of the national public school system to provide services to as many Filipino children with special needs.

"This could be done by establishing Inclusive

Special ed centers in public schools needed

Education Learning Resource Centers in all public schools divisions nationwide," he said. "The SPED Centers shall function as a resource center that shall assist in promoting inclusive education to capacitate regular schools to effectively handle the needs of children and youth with disability."

The lawmaker added that each center will also be equipped with the facilities and personnel necessary to provide care and instruction to children and youth with special needs, specifically special education teachers and other specialists.

According to Gatchalian, estimates from the Department of Education indicate that as of School Year (SY) 2016-2017, there are approximately 303,109 Filipino children in public schools with special education needs.

"Physical, cognitive, psychological, and/or communication disabilities prevent them from fully

participating in regular schools, he said.

Moreover, the regular schools, whether public or private, are often incapable of providing these children with the care, attention, and guidance that they require for the development of their physical, cognitive, and social skills," he added.

The senator noted that given the current set-up, as of SY 2016-2017, there were around 303,000 children with special needs enrolled in public elementary and secondary schools who may have not been provided with the needed education and care.

"Much remains to be done in addressing the gap with respect to the provision of special education in the country," he stressed.

Every child has the right to an education commensurate with his abilities and to the development of his skills for the improvement of his capacity for service to himself and to his fellowmen," Gatchalian added.

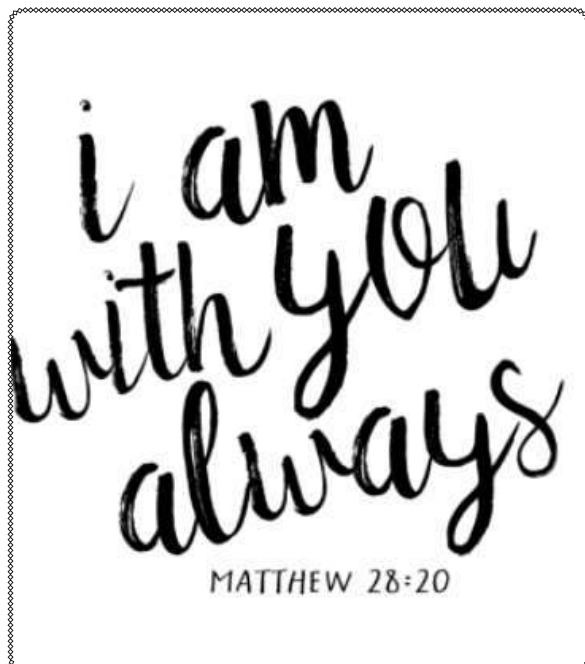

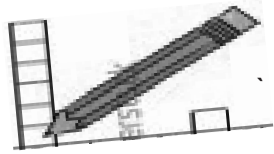

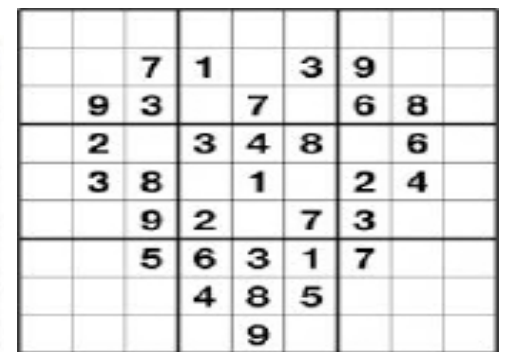
