Sec. DOTr Arthur Tugade Visit: Since actual construction works started in April after 19 years of delay, the long-promised LRT-1 Cavite Extension is now at 20% completion rate.

Ongoing works include Civil Works and Electromechanical Systems (E&M) components, manufacturing of procured Light Rail Vehicles, the expansion

of Baclaran Depot, and the construction of the new Zapote Depot.

This 11.7-kilometer rail extension line is eyed for partial operations for the first five stations (Redemptorist, MIA, Asiaworld, Ninoy Aquino, and Dr. Santos) by the 4th quarter of 2021.

The Cavite extension will be linked to the existing line south of Baclaran Station, and will run all the way to Niog in Bacoor, Cavite.

It is expected to cut travel time between Baclaran and Cavite from one to two hours down to just 25 minutes. It is also poised to double the current LRT-1 passenger capacity from 400,000 to 800,000 by the time it is completed.

EDITORYAL:

Defense Secretary Delfin Lorenzana may have gone overboard when he described the 100,000 or so Chinese nationals working in offshore gaming operations here as potential spies for Beijing.

The basis for the secretary's concern is that many of the 56 or so official Philippine offshore gaming operations are located near strategic defense installations.

Several are in Araneta Center in Cubao, Quezon City and Eastwood, which are less than a 20-minute drive from the Armed Forces of the Philippines headquarters in Camp Aguinaldo and Philippine National Police headquarters in Camp Crame.

Other POGO hubs are located in Resorts World in Pasay City near the Air Force and Army headquarters, and on Macapagal Avenue near the Navy headquarters in Roxas Boulevard.

A POGO hub

is also being eyed at a 36-hectare former resort in Kawit, Cavite just a few kilometers from the Air Force's 15th Strike Wing and the Heracleo Alano naval base in Sangley Point

But these details are a red herring in Lorenzana's frankly alarmist warning. In an age where digital surveillance and drones are the norm, it really doesn't matter where the potential spies are located. Does the good secretary suggest that hordes of Chinese POGO workers will one day stream out of their offices and try to surreptitiously infiltrate our military and police bases?

The suggestion is ludicrous—almost but not quite as silly as the tit-for-tat response from the Chinese ambassador, who said Filipino workers in China could also be regarded as potential spies. The Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corp., the agency that licenses

POGOs, wants to move them and their Chinese workers to "self-contained communities" far away from the military bases, much like the Spaniards did when they were forced to settle in a ghetto called the Parian, just within range of the cannons of Intramuros.

Against backdrop of Chinese objections that the plan might violate their citizens' rights, Pagcor insists that the move would be done to protect the Chinese, offering them residential spaces with their own food establishments, groceries or convenience stores, wellness and recreational facilities, service shops and other amenities which may be needed by foreign workers.

All this is utter nonsense and it is remarkable that so much time—and even a Senate investigation—have been wasted on the subject.

If the Chinese workers indeed constitute

a threat to national security, creating new Chinatowns will do nothing to stop them. As President Rodrigo Duterte has observed, spies don't need to be physically near their intelligence targets.

If there is a social cost to having more than 100,000 new foreign workers who do not always play nice with the local population, then by all means, let us have that conversation.

Pagcor reports that POGOs posted revenues of P657 million in 2016, P3.924 billion in 2017, P7.365 billion in 2018 and are well on the way to hitting P8 billion this year. Still, the wisdom of establishing an industry that excludes Filipino workers and customers certainly deserves more debate.

But the discussions should focus on real issues, not imagined spies, wild accusations, and segregation by race. That is a downhill path that helps no one.



Senator Win Gatchalian filed a resolution to investigate the uncollected taxes from registered and unregistered foreign workers, including those in the Philippine Offshore Gaming Operators (POGO) industry, as well as related issues on the effective implementation of Philippine tax, immigration, and labor laws

In filing Senate Resolution No. 89, Gatchalian, noted that the significant influx of Chinese POGO workers and the approximately 130,000 individuals not paying taxes to the Philippine government have "clearly raised red flags on the implementation of our tax, immigration and labor laws."

"There is a need to review our capability and enhance our capacity to enforce our tax, immigration, and labor laws to balance the protection we need to accord our people vis-a-vis to the contribution of industries and foreign workers to the country's

economic growth," he stressed.

The lawmaker said that based on the Department of Finance's computation, the government is losing much as P22.5 billion annually from uncollected taxes. He added that the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) estimates that P18,750, excluding taxes on allowances and fringe benefits, are not being collected from each foreign worker every month.

Gatchalian also pointed out last month, the BIR only collected P200 million from foreigners who were mostly Chinese working in the POGO sector. July was the first month that the government mandated the automatic withholding of personal income taxes from the foreign workers.

Citing news reports, Gatchalian further said that the BIR was having difficulty issuing Tax Identification Numbers (TINs) at a faster pace and bigger volume than usual. For July, the BIR reportedly was only able to issue 10,000 TINs to some 130,000 unregistered POGO workers in Manila, Parañaque, and Pasay.

He said these

implementation draw-backs, including the failure to monitor the revenues and revenue-generating activities of the POGO industry, do not only have an impact on the potential tax revenue loss, but also raises issues on fairness with respect to Filipino tax payers who regularly pay taxes.

"It is imperative for the Senate to conduct an assessment and careful analysis to determine how these tax collection agencies can better perform their functions prior to introducing another set of laws which these agencies may have difficulty implementing," he said.

"It is also the Senate's duty to review policies set forth by the Executive as it annually deliberates on the government's expenditure plan, which is affected by the projected tax revenues and other macroeconomic fundamental assumptions," Gatchalian added.

All foreign individuals, whether a resident or not of the Philippines, are liable to pay income tax under Sections 24(A) (1)(c) and 25(A)(1) of the National Internal Revenue Code, as amended, on their taxable income derived from all sources within the Philippines.

DOF helping provide cheap electricity in underserved BARMM island-provinces

The Department of Finance (DOF) has extended its assistance to the new Bangsamoro government in tapping funding sources for a plan to provide stable and affordable supply of electric power to the autonomous region's underserved island-provinces, as part of ongoing government efforts to open livelihood opportunities, attract investments and create more jobs in these areas.

Finance Secretary Carlos Dominguez III discussed during his meeting last week with Chief Minister Al Hajj Murad Ibrahim of the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM) and other BARMM officials a plan to involve the private sector and explore overseas funding from Islamic countries in the Middle East to implement the electrification program in the region's remote provinces and towns .

"This is an opportunity for (the Middle Eastern countries) to assist in providing funding for infrastructure projects in the BARMM area," Dominguez told Murad and the other BARMM officials present at the meeting at the DOF office in Manila. "Power generation is crucial to you especially in the island-communities and some communities that are off the (power) grid."

BARMM Ministers Naguib Sinarimbo of the Ministry of the Interior and Local Government and Eduard Guerra of the Ministry of Finance, Budget and Management; and other officials of the Bangsamoro government were also at the meeting held last Thursday (Aug.8).

Dominguez has committed to assist BARMM in setting up its new government, especially in handling its fiscal affairs during an earlier meeting with Guerra.

In a letter to Dominguez, Guerra said their first meeting "was definitely a good start for a genuine partnership with your office in achieving the goals of peace and development in the Bangsamoro autonomous region."

"We sincerely recognize the warm welcome, and we could not thank you enough for giving us the opportunity to discuss initially fiscal matters and ways to move forward," Guerra said in his letter.

During the meeting with Murad at the DOF office, Dominguez also broached the possibility of approaching the Development Bank of the Philippines (DBP) and other state lending institutions to help finance BARMM's electrification program.

Murad, in response, said that providing electricity "is one of our big challenges because in many areas, we don't have power sources."

He agreed with Dominguez that partnering with the private sector would be one way to resolve the lack of power supply in BARMM's farflung communities.

At the meeting were representatives of Power-source Philippines, led by its chairman Aloysius Colayco, who, in turn, proposed the use of renewable energy sources, such as stand-alone microgrids as a solution to BARMM's power supply problems in its remote communities

The BARMM officials welcomed the proposal and suggested that the electrification program start in the provinces of Basilan, Tawi-Tawi and Sulu and Bongo Island in Cotabato City.

Murad said Powersource can discuss its proposal with the BARMM Department of Environment, Natural Resource and Energy.

Guerra and Sinarimbo suggested that an inventory and ocular inspection be conducted to determine what areas of the BARMM are unserved and underserved in terms of power supply.

Sinarimbo pointed out for instance, that with an affordable supply of electric power, Basilan can expand the economic potentials of its production of rubber and coconut. "As of now, they cannot process these prod-





DILG visits Carmona for SGLG National Validation




