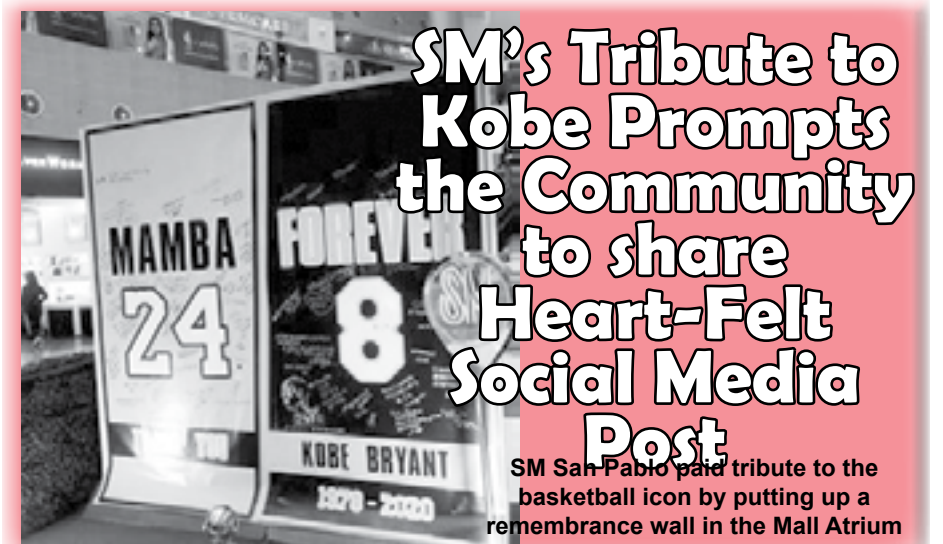

EDITORIAL:

Sober urgency

In one weekend, the Philippines rapidly went from having no confirmed case of the dreaded novel coronavirus (nCoV) to becoming the first country outside of China to register an nCoV-related death.

The Department of Health announced Sunday that a 44-year-old man from Wuhan with an nCoV infection has died, marking the first such death outside of China.

He also represents the second confirmed case and in the Philippines as his traveling companion, a 38-year-old woman from Wuhan, was the country's first confirmed patient. Before they were diagnosed, the two had traveled to Cebu and Dumaguete, before flying back to Manila. Her illness was announced Jan. 30.

Both patients are from Wuhan, China, the center of the virus outbreak that has killed more than 300 and infected more than 14,000.

Both arrived in the Philippines via Hong Kong on Jan 21. The man was admitted to a hospital for pneumonia on Jan 25 after having a fever, cough, and sore throat.

Trying to put a positive spin on the developments, Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque III emphasized that these were "imported" cases and there was no evidence of local transmission. While this is indeed a reason to be thankful, it is no excuse for complacency. After all, a number of other countries such as the United States, have reported person-to-person transmission of the disease even when the carrier is showing no symptoms.

That we are the first country with a recorded death traced to nCoV is hardly reassuring that our hospitals will be able to cope with more confirmed cases.

We are also wary about government assurances that our health workers are adequately protected from infection as they treat the confirmed nCoV cases.

To allay public fears, Health officials must quickly show that they have progressed in their contact tracing, and that the people that the two confirmed cases came in contact with are being quarantined and monitored.

The nCoV outbreak in Wuhan was first reported in December—so authorities have been rather slow to react. For example, the government only banned the entry of Chinese nationals from Hubei province on Jan. 31, leaving a month-long window during which travelers could have spread the virus to the local population.

The nCoV outbreak is deadly serious, and we cannot afford to act like it is business as usual. On the other hand, we shouldn't let our fears get the better of us and slip into racist actions, such as one private university which ordered its Chinese students to quarantine themselves for two weeks "to ensure a healthy and virus-free environment." We need to move forward with sober urgency.

The People's Republic of China has pledged a 1-million renminbi (equivalent to P7.2 million) cash donation to the Philippine government to assist in the ongoing disaster relief efforts for the displaced residents in Luzon who were forced to flee their homes following the Jan. 12 eruption of Taal Volcano, the Department of Finance (DOF) has said.

In its diplomatic correspondence sent to the DOF, China, through its embassy in Manila, said it "is looking forward to handing over the .... donation as soon as possible."

On behalf of the Philippine government, Finance Secretary Carlos Dominguez III thanked the Chinese embassy for its donation, which, he said "would be of great help to the government's ongoing efforts to assist the Taal evacuees."

"We thank the

People's Republic of China for its donation, which is just one of the many it has provided to the Philippines to help victims of calamities. This concrete expression of sympathy and support to our countrymen further strengthens our bilateral ties and reflects the warm relations between our two countries," Secretary Dominguez said over the weekend.

Secretary Dominguez pointed out that China has consistently provided assistance to calamity victims in the country, as he recalled that the Chinese government also donated RMB 3 million (around P22 million) to Mindanao during the series of earthquakes that struck the island last October.

He likewise recalled that China was among the first countries to offer its assistance in helping rebuild the devastated city of Marawi in Mindanao.

Veterinary Mission for Animals Affected by Taal Volcano Eruption

Persistent on its goal to safeguard the welfare of the animals who have been affected by the eruption of Taal Volcano, the Provincial Veterinary Office (PVO) led by Dr. May Magno has initiated efforts to visit and conduct veterinary missions at Tagaytay City for the treatment of rescued animals on January 29, 2020.

The Provincial Veterinary Office, together with some veterinarians from the City Veterinarian Office of Tagaytay and the whole staff from Born to be Wild, a Philippine television travelogue show broadcast under GMA Network which was hosted by Dr. Nielsen Donato roamed around the vicinity of Picnic Grove in Barangay Sungay East and gave immediate health assessments and treatments to

the animals. Ten goats were given vitamin supplements while four others were dewormed. Out of sixty-four horses which were used in horseback riding in Picnic Grove, 58 were provided vitamins and were dewormed while six were given dextrose through IV line (D5 LRS) and six have undergone eye flushing using the normal saline solution. A farm in barangay Zambal, also in Tagaytay City was also visited as veterinarians checked the medical conditions of 22 horses. They have provided vitamin supplements to 16 horses, dextrose through IV line (D5 LRS) to six horses and wound treatment and vitamin supplements to five horses. Loan amortization moratorium for Taal disaster-stricken residents needed

To help them rebuild their lives amid the calamity, Senator Win Gatchalian is calling for the imposition of a one-year moratorium on loan amortizations for residents affected by the Taal Volcano eruption.

Immediately upon Congress' resumption of session on Monday, Gatchalian has filed Senate Resolution No. 289 (SRN 289) urging the Government Service Insurance System (GSIS), the Social Security System (SSS) and the Home Development Mutual Fund (Pag-IBIG Fund) to extend calamity or emergency loans to and/or impose a one-year moratorium on loan amortizations of members who are residents of the Taal volcano eruption calamity areas.

Gatchalian made this promise to affected residents when he visited Batangas to check the condition of the evacuees and to personally turn over cash assistance to affected towns, while a hazardous explosive eruption might still happen in hours or days.

SRN 289 also urges Local Government Units (LGUs) to be more lenient to affected businesses on the payment of real property taxes, renewal of business permits and imposition of penalties. Simultaneously, it calls on both private and government banks to defer loan payments of affected borrowers.

The lawmaker said that the GSIS, SSS and Pag-IBIG Fund have not yet issued a moratorium with a term longer than 6 months on the loan amortizations of their respective members and/or pensioners residing in the said calamity areas, nor have these agencies extended calamity assistance or emergency loans to affected members.

Records from the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council (PDRRC) as of January 18 showed that 37,355 families or 162,728 individuals were staying in various evacuation centers in the Province of Batangas.

"Kami po ay nakikiramay at nakikiisa sa ating mga kababayan sa Batangas. Nandito ho kami para tuloy-tuloy na sumuporta sa mga pangangailangan ng ating mga kababayan at sigisigaduhin po naming sa loob ng Senado na maibigay po ang pondo para sa rehabilitasyon ng mga nasirang gusali," Gatchalian said.

By imposing a one-year moratorium on loan amortization and suspending the imposition of penalties by LGUs to calamity-affected business establishments will not only help affected citizens to recover and rebuild, it will also facilitate and reinvigorate the economy of the affected areas.

Trackdown on other plane passengers start as Chinese tourist found positive with Coronavirus dies

MANILA, Philippines - The trackdown on other co-passengers on board a Philippine Airlines (PAL) flight on January 25, where a 44-year-old Chinese tourist who was the first reported death of coronavirus infection in the country, has already started.

Government authorities yesterday sent a team of trackers in Cebu and Dumaguete City where the first fatality of nCoV also went into after their arrival at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport. They would check on places visited by the couple such as restaurants, hotels and other tourist destinations.

Government health experts also said there might have been other passengers on board the PAL flight who have also needed medical attention and have shown early signs of the deadly virus.

Meanwhile, the wife of the Chinese tourist who was the first recorded nCoV-infected patient in the country, as confirmed by a lab test in Australia, is still alive and now under close watch of the government, most especially that her husband had already died.

Earlier DOH secretary Francisco Duque III told reporters the Philippine Government has enough facility

to monitor the conditions of patients infected with the deadly virus which originated from Wuhan, China.

PAL spokesperson Cielo Villaluna said they have already contacted most of the 150 passengers onboard the said PAL flight PR 2542 from Dumaguete to Manila last January 25, but most of them have not experienced symptoms of the coronavirus.

"So far, based sa update—kasi may emergency meeting tayo kahapon—lahat ng pasahero, wala namang sakit," Villaluna said in an interview with DZMM on Monday.

She said the air-

line company would again give updates after all of the passengers are being contacted. There are passengers, she said, have not registered their phone numbers so that they find it difficult to make contact with these passengers.

Villaluna advised PAL passengers onboard flight 2542 on January 25 to immediately contact the hotlines of the Department of Health should they feel something bad on their health conditions.

PAL earlier reported that the crew of the said flight have already been under a quarantine period of 14 days and the plane was also disinfected for safer flights in the future. (MDN)

SM Malls in Laguna vows to help prevent the Impending Threat of the Deadly NCoV

There is an emerging, rapidly evolving threat of a new virus around the world, including the Philippines and Department of Health is closely monitoring this outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus (named "2019-nCoV") that was first detected in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China.

Coronaviruses are a large family of viruses that are common in many different species of animals, including camels, cattle, cats, and bats. Rarely, animal coronaviruses can infect people and then spread between people such as with MERS and SARS.

The risk to individuals is said to be dependent on exposure. This is a serious public health threat. The fact that this virus has caused severe illness and sustained person-to-person spread in China is concerning and this is the main reason an initiative for precautionary measures has been taken by the SM Group.

One of the ways to make sure SM keeps their mall patrons' safe is by keeping SM Malls clean all the

time. SM recently deployed their Sanitation Team to clean railings, escalators, elevators and door handles to make sure they got all the public points covered.

According to Ms. Niña Wong, Public Relations Manager of SM City San Pablo "Everyone's safety not only our shoppers but also our front liners are all being given great consideration. Our Mall guards and Mall maintenance are being asked to wear a disposable facemask; the mall also started putting alcohol dispensers at its entrances, comfort rooms, and offices."

More cases are likely to be identified in the coming days. There is currently no vaccine to prevent 2019-nCoV infection. The best way to prevent infection is to avoid being exposed to this virus. "Same practice has been implemented to all the Laguna Malls including SM City Calmba and SM Sta Rosa." added Ms. Wong. Mallgoers who feel unwell may proceed to the Mall Clinic at the lower ground level for immediate medical attention.

# CARD MRI releases PhP 21.9 Million to 17K typhoon-affected families

# DENR CALABARZON celebrates the first year anniversary of Battle for Manila Bay in Rosario, Cavite.

Amidst the hustle and bustle of the roundabouts brought about by the eruption of Taal, there is still some light when it comes to the issue of our environment.

DENR CALABARZON as spearheaded by its Regional Executive Director, Gilbert C. Gonzales, is happy to report the progress of the Battle for Manila Bay.

Said project started in January 27, 2019 and was initiated by DENR Secretary Roy A. Cimatu. From January to December 2019, they

were able to mobilize 6,260 participants in the river and coastal clean-up drives within the provinces of Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, and Rizal. On top of that, they have collected a total of 56,970 kilogram of solid wastes. This is not in any way counted with the other clean-ups initiated by individual LGUs.

Moreover, DENR has also funded the involvement of 483 river marshalls or Bantay-Linis Ilog. These marshalls

were able to collect a total of 1,051,604 kilograms of solid wastes.

Another achievement worth mentioning is the 139,495.37 kilograms of submerged garbage collected from Zapote River and coastal areas of Bacoor and Rosario. And they did not stop with that because along side the clean-ups, the information drive on Ecological Solid Waste Management in the priority areas, specifically those near water bodies, were intensified.

As of now, they have delineated 46 kilometers of easement area along the coast of Cavite and they have installed eight trash traps in the tributaries of Cavite, Laguna, Rizal. Regularly, they conduct water quality monitoring to assure the quality of water in terms of coliform count.

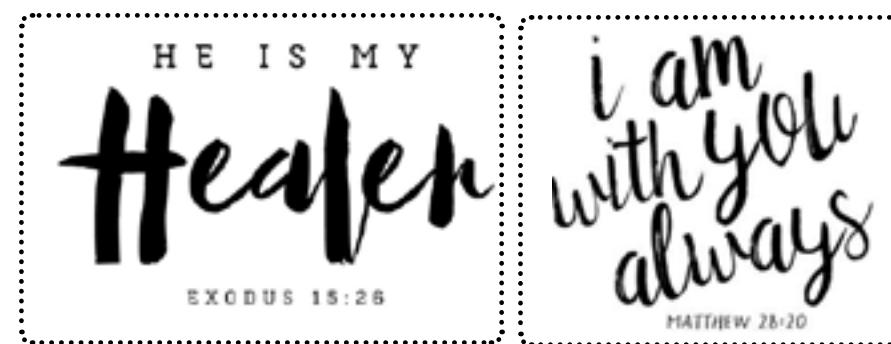

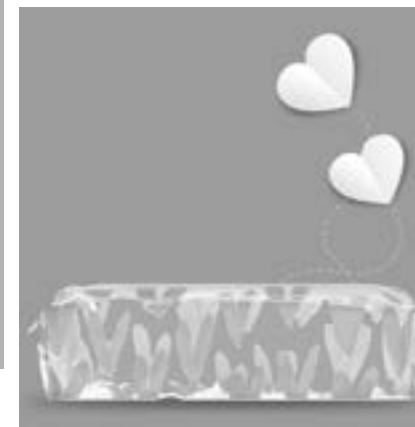

## DOST reiterates support for S&T research on herbal and other products for health and related purposes

The Department of Science and Technology (DOST) has reiterated its support commitments to initiatives and collaboration undertakings in scientific research, production and commercialization of organic herbal food supplements and other product that beneficial to Filipinos and the entire world.

Representing DOST Secretary Fortunato de la Peña at the groundbreaking rites for a facility at the Isabela State University (ISU) main campus in Echague, Isabela recently, Undersecretary Brenda Manzano affirmed their agency's "full support for collaborative undertakings" related DOST's mandate and mission.

The ISU facility is designed as a storage and processing center of materials for the manufacture of herbal food supplements and alternative herbal medicine preparations. It has financial assistance from DOST and the Filipino-Chinese Chamber of Commerce Inc. which was facilitated by former ISU Board of Regents member Charles T. Lim.

The groundbreaking ceremonies were presided over by Usec Dr. Nazareth-Manzano, ISU president Dr. Ricmar Aquino, Charles T. Lim of FCCC, and Bauertek Corp. Board Chair and General Manager Richard Nixon Gomez. The project is a partnership undertaking among DOST, ISU, FCCC and Bauertek Corp. Also present at the rites were Cagayan Valley (R-2) Regional Director Engr. Sancho Mabborang and other officials of the project's partner institutions.

Immediately after the groundbreaking rites, the partner agencies' officials signed a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for the project. Dr Manzano described the undertaking as a "rare and ideal partnership among the government, private industry sector and academe."

A 10-hectare area of the ISU Echague campus has been set aside as a prototype model plantation of "Malunggay" (moringa) and other herbs like Piperine (pepper), Curcumin (turmeric) and Guyabano which

have been proven to have medicinal value and properties. Scientific botanical research studies on plant growth, nutrient enhancement, medical value exploration and related concerns will be undertaken in prototype plantation which may later be expanded. Gomez noted that the plants mentioned are used in cosmetic and related products.

"Turmeric, however, is a real deal," for herbal food supplements which can be upscaled to global marketing since it is a leading herbal supplement ingredient and tops traditional medicine worldwide, said Gomez, Bauertek's founder. The processed plantation products will subsequently be transferred to Bauertek for laboratory treatments, commercialization and packaging for commercialization and marketing distribution.

In a statement, Manzano said the partnership linkage will bolster the science and technology (S&T) ecosystem, making it productive". She also lauded ISU president Ricmar Aquino for prioritizing S&T, which commit-



ment will "add to the body of knowledge with outputs that benefit the general public."

Director Mabborang, for his part, stressed the "undertaking goes beyond mere research and would redound to community empowerment." He said it will help farmers cultivate and raise and raise high-value alternative crops that can provide them significantly higher income than traditional farming to which Gomez eagerly agreed.

ISU president Ricmar Aquino thanked the partner-agencies for involving their institution in the partnership. In his speech during the rites, he pledged that ISU "will do its part with all the technology and resources it has to help make in Region number one" in agricultural productivity.

Simultaneous with the talks on herb production, another agreement was forged between ISU and the Red Dragon Farm (RDF) Feed Live-

stock and Foods Inc. the firm behind the Fresh Options Meat shop. The accord will make the Technology Business Incubation (TBI) project of ISU's Cagayan Valley Small Ruminants Research Center (CVSRRC) Integrated Slaughterhouse and Meat Processing Center, as the platform for RDF's North Luzon expansion, and its production of processed-meat products particularly pork tocino, pork longganisa, and pork tapa. ###
