CALABARZON DELTA CASES NOW AT 148



Department of Health (DOH)- CALABARZON (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon) Regional Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit (RESU) today disclosed a total of 148 cases of the dreaded Delta Variant in the region.

From the five provinces Laguna tops the list with 48 recorded cases; Cavite follows with 44 cases; Rizal with 33; Batangas with 15; and Quezon with 8 Delta variant cases.

Improved access to quality basic services and social protection through enabling policies.

Today, the Filipino youth stand at the crossroads of the country's history, the challenges high on their eye range, as they mobilize their force to help battle against the pandemic-with infections and deaths rising, with their acquired talent and other skills while confronting the challenges of volunteerism.

Note, for instance, that in the Philippines, which has the largest generation of young people in its history, 30 million young people between the ages of 10 and 24 account for 28 percent of the population: 68 percent of the interviewed youth indicated their participation in political matters is that of a follower and 62 percent said they seldom act as the leader-initiator of resolutions.

Only one out of four youth indicated that they are protest-initiators or activists in political issues, the majority (89 percent) of the young people feel that they have to be informed, involved, and consulted by adults and youth leaders on matters related to youth development. The youth can properly be a positive force in helping disseminate the importance of participation in the presidential elections next year They owe it to themselves and the generations after them to encourage people to register and vote.

The country's future is in their hands

Review of the Growth Assumptions for FY 2021

The Development Budget Coordination Committee (DBCC) revised its growth assumptions for FY 2021 from 6.0 to 7.0 percent to 4.0 to 5.0 percent in light of the reimposition of stricter mobility restrictions in various areas of the country to effectively address the heightened risks brought about by the COVID-19 Delta variant.

In the first half of 2021, our careful balancing of COVID-19 and non-COVID-19 risks allowed us to improve GDP growth to 11.8 percent in Q2 2021. Without the present spike, the original growth target of 6.0 to 7.0 percent would have been achievable. However, with the global emergence of the Delta variant, the second half growth outlook was revised downwards to reflect the additional restrictions imposed by the government, which are necessary to curb its spread.

Our strategy is to continue managing the risks carefully by imposing granular quarantines, while allowing a vast number of people to earn a living. We will continue to use this period to accelerate the roll-out of the vaccination program. As of August 15, a total of 27.8 million doses have been administered, consisting of 15.2 million and 12.6 million for the first and second dose, respectively. Rest assured that we will continue to work closely with the local government units and the private sector to accelerate the country's vaccination rates.

Last August 5, the country recorded an alltime high of 710,482 jabs in a day, while in the past week, the total average daily jabs reached more than 475,000. At this rate, and with recent vaccine deliveries arriving as scheduled, we are confident that we can inoculate the required number of individuals, particularly in the densely populated areas, by the end of 2021. We expect that this will significantly reduce the need for wide-scale quarantines, especially in key economic centers where the majority of Filipinos work. In this regard, the DBCC retained its growth targets for 2022 at 7.0 to 9.0 percent, and for 2023 and 2024 at 6.0 to 7.0 percent.

The DBCC will continue to monitor the effects of the Delta variant and the enforcement of community quarantines, and proactively manage the risks to help the economy recover. (PR)

DOE's lack of assurance of brownout-free elections next year is unnacceptable!

Senator Win Gatchalian assailed energy officials' apparent indifference in arresting any possibility of rotational brownouts during the election period next year, when the country's estimated 60 million voters will exercise their right to choose their leaders in the national and local levels.

"This is unacceptable! Kaya tayo merong Department of Energy ay para siguraduhing meron tayong kuryente all the time. Isa lang ang trabaho ng DOE, yan ay siguraduhin na may kuryente tayo. So, it's unacceptable na even an iota or possibility of brownouts during the election period ay hahayaan nilang mangyari. It's their job to address that situation," Gatchalian emphasized.

The Senate Energy Committee Chairperson lamented DOE Secretary Alfonso Cusi's lack of any categorical statement in ensuring the sufficiency of power supply when this early, energy officials already forecasted the thinning of power supply on election day and thereafter.

He adds that as early as now, the DOE should identify solutions and undertake steps to ensure there will be no brownouts during the 2022 elections.

"Importante na proactive tayo. Nakita natin na tuwing summer may ganitong banta so as early as now gumagawa na tayo dapat ng paraan. For example, pinaka mabilis diyan ay scheduling. 'Yung ating mga planta dapat ngayon pa lang nire-repair na nila, kumuha na ng spare parts, ayusin na nila para pagdating ng summer, tuloy-tuloy ang suplay ng kuryente," Gatchalian said.

"Alam naman natin na pagdating ng March ay maraming nagme-maintain ng planta at marami ring nasisira. Kaya dapat ngayon pa lang pinapalitan na ang spare parts at agahan ang pagme-maintain para hindi umabot uli sa summer season," he added.


Gatchalian said his Committee on Energy will resume its hearing towards the end of the year in preparation for next year.

"We do not want any cloud of doubt pagdating sa automated elections natin. 'Yan ang mga typical sources ng pagdududa, yung brownout at walang kuryente," Gatchalian said in reference to the integrity and accuracy of election results as under existing law, the counting of ballots cast is carried out via an automated system.

The Philippine Guarantee Corp. (PhilGuarantee) has provided guarantees to loans in the agriculture sector amounting to P3.5 billion in the first half of 2021, which is already 95 percent of the state firm's target of P3.7 billon for this entire year.

According to PhilGuarantee president-CEO Alberto Pascual, the loans guaranteed through the firm's partner-lending institutions (PLIs) have thus far benefited 35,360 small farmers and fisherfolk.

Pascual said in his report to Finance Secretary and PhilGuarantee chairman Carlos Dominguez III that the crops subsector accounted for the bulk of the guaranteed loans, with P3.35 billion or 96 percent covered over the January-June 2021 period.

"For second quarter 2021, guaranteed loans to the agriculture sector by 47 PLIs have already reached P3.499 billion, which is already 95 percent of the 2021 target of P3.675 billion, benefitting 35,360 small farmers and fisherfolk. The outstanding balance as of 30 June 2021 amounted to P1.247 billion," Pascual said in his report.

As the administrator of the Agricultural Guarantee Fund Pool (AGFP), PhilGuarantee encourages its PLIs to lend to small farmers and fisherfolks or their organizations, by providing guarantee coverage to their unsecured agricultural production loans.

The livestock subsector came in second in terms of the amount of guaranteed loans as of June of this year, with borrowings amounting to P112.63 million, followed by fisheries with P27.86 million; and poultry with P12.03 million.

"Since the beginning of the COVID-19 crisis in March 2020, PhilGuarantee lost no time to enable its mandate and respond to the clarion call of the government to provide assistance to affected agri-based workers by way of its guarantee program," Pascual said.

Pascual said that last year, PhilGuarantee's approved guarantee lines to 41 PLIs extending loans to the agriculture sector amounted to P5.14 billion, with guaranteed loans totaling P4.25 billion.

"This amount is 21.4 percent beyond our goal of P3.5 billion and resulted into assisting 48,038 small farmers and fisherfolk nationwide. Outstanding balance as of 31 December 2020 amounted to P401.5 million," Pascual said.

During the Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ) period last year, Pascual said the Phil-Guarantee Governing Board approved the reduction of the rate of guarantee fee from 1 percent to 0.5 percent and the increase of the guarantee coverage from 85 percent to 90 percent of the loan amount for palay farmers borrowing through the AGFP.

These measures were effective from April 15 to July 15, 2020. (PR)

According to Manila, VR can also be a form of tourism marketing, which is a way to keep the institution under the radar of travelers. "VR opens the opportunity for us to market our destinations so that our institution will remain on top of the minds of our travelers."

With VR as one of its adapted mediums, Hijos Tours came up with the idea of integrating VR into the program of CMDI Tagum's Tourism Management students.

"Through VR, we can recreate our culture, revive the past, preserve our heritage, and make room for edutainment (education and entertainment) in our curriculum," said Manila.

Manila added that visitors who do not have access to internet infrastructures and smartphones may enjoy traveling virtually through the installment of the Tourism e-Laboratory, which houses an LCD Projector, Samsung Tablets, and VR



goggles for projecting self-paced VR tours, promotional videos, and 360° VR tours.

"The pandemic really helped us reevaluate and improve the things we do for our students," said CMDI Senior Executive Vice President/Chief Operating Officer Dr. Edzel A. Ramos. He added, "As we continue to convert our services online, we saw the need to install the Tourism e-Laboratory to maximize e-learning for our students. We believe that this is a great way to really immerse them in the field of tourism especially as we transition to a New Normal in this day and age."

A brainchild of Hijos Tours, the Tourism e-Laboratory fulfills one of the key strategies of CARD MRI in its 10-20-80 campaign to reinforce digitization in education and tourism and to reach out to more partners and communities by means of its technological initiatives.

Presidential Adviser for Entrepreneurship and Go Negosyo founder Joey Concepcion and Transportation Secretary Arthur Tugade are exploring the possibility of vaccinating the country's public utility bus drivers, in a bid to deploy buses for fully vaccinated passengers in the National Capital Region By doing so, (NCR). the public transportation system will become part of the protective 'bubble,' which is based on Concepcion's proposal to create micro-herd immunity in small spaces, such as homes and workplaces as part of the overall effort to safely reopen more parts of the battered economy.

"We are looking at deploying buses for fully-vaccinated passengers to protect them from getting infected by the unvaccinated ones. With this, our public transportation can actually bridge the gap between homes workplaces, which and will in turn help us create 'micro-herd immunity' through the safety provided by these protective bubbles," Concepcion said. He shared that this so-called bubble in workplaces is actually a growing trend given the intensified vaccination rollouts in the country. 'In fact,

I'm glad to share that most of the factory workers in my company are already vaccinated, and with this, our company actually creates 'micro-herd immunity' in their workplaces." Concepcion expressed.

Meanwhile, Tugade expressed his gratitude to Concepcion for his efforts to help the country defeat the prolonged COVID-19 pandemic. "Thank you Sir Joey for all your assistance for us to defeat the pandemic. Rest assured, we'll support your initiatives for us to quell the spread of the virus. The entire Department [of Transportation] is willing to assist side-byside," he said in Filipino. To hasten the vaccination of drivers across the country, Tugade asked Concepcion for help in accessing 40,000 doses of vaccines for drivers. who are going to be at the forefront of these buses for the fully vaccinated. "We are seeking for your assistance on 40,000 doses of vaccines for us to immediately vaccinate our drivers," Tugade said. Concepcion said he would do his best to make this possible.

"We thank you for having a meeting with us since this is an avenue for us to ask for more vaccines for our group," he said, "We also would like to have additional vaccines so we can finally increase our vehicles' operational capacity." Meanwhile, DOTr Assistant Secretary for Road Transport and Infrastructure Steven Pastor shared the recent assistance from the private sector through the 'Tsuperhero: Vaccination Drive," which was three launched weeks ago.
