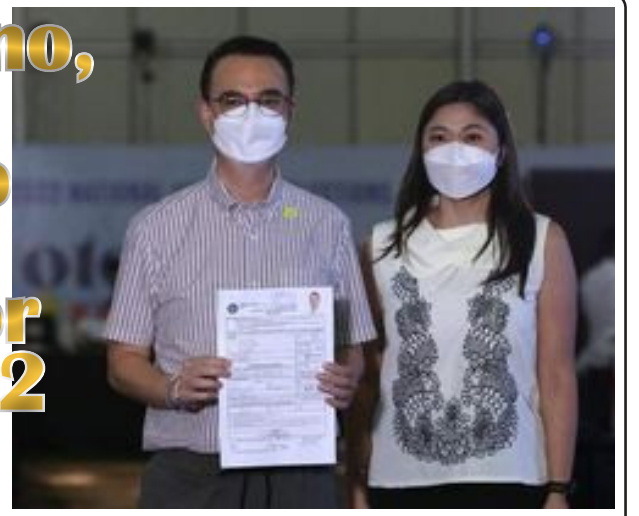

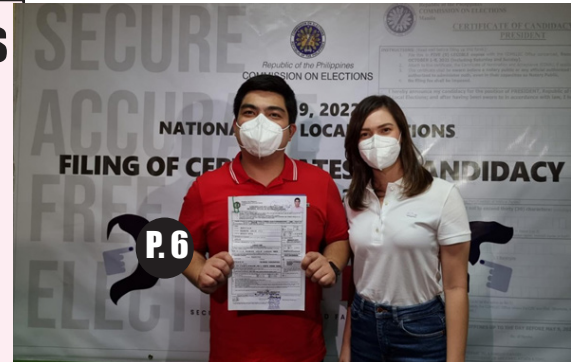

The Department of Finance (DOF) under Secretary Carlos Dominguez III has continued to provide opportunities for its employees to further hone their skills and knowledge through various foreign and local scholarships, with the goal of further professionalizing its ranks and improving the delivery of services to the public.

Under Dominguez, 416 employees of the DOF and its attached agencies were able, or are now, pursuing their masteral or doctoral studies by availing of local scholarship programs, while another 250 were able to study overseas through foreign scholarship grants.

These foreign scholarships include those offered by the National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies in Tokyo, Japan; Seoul National University in South Korea; International Institute of Social Studies in The Netherlands; Australian National University in Canberra, Australia; Harvard Kennedy School of Executive Education, and the Duke Center for International Development in the United States (US); and various universities in the United Kingdom (UK) through the Chevening Scholarship program.

Local scholarships availed by DOF employees include those offered by the Asian Institute of Management (AIM)

in Makati City; and the Development Academy of the Philippines (DAP) in Tagaytay and Pasig City, to name a few.

Majority of the scholars sent abroad under both the terms of Dominguez and his immediate predecessor, Secretary Cesar Purisima, came from the Land Bank of the Philippines (Land-Bank).

A total of 352 local scholars and 168 foreign scholarship recipients were from LandBank under Dominguez, while Purisima's term had 169 local and 198 foreign scholars from LandBank.

In the DOF, 14 employees were able to secure local scholarships, while 23 became foreign scholars so far under Dominguez. Fifteen DOF employees availed of local scholarships and 14 got foreign scholarships under Purisima.

The Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) sent 20 employees abroad on foreign scholarships, while one availed of a local scholarship grant, under Dominguez. Three SEC employees became foreign scholars under Purisima, while no one availed of local scholarships.

From the Development Bank of the Philippines (DBP), there were 20 local and 15 foreign scholars under Dominguez, and 15 local and 9 foreign scholars under Purisima.

Under Dominguez, the Bureau of the Treasury (BTr) sent 12 employees abroad as foreign scholars and another 12 received local scholarships. There were 8 local and 1 foreign scholar from BTr under Purisima.

In the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR), there were 9 local and 6 foreign scholars under Purisima while there were 8 foreign scholars and no local scholar under Dominguez.

There were no local scholars in the Bureau of Customs (BOC) during the terms of both Purisima and Dominguez. The BOC had 3 foreign scholars under Purisima and 2 so far under Dominguez.

The Insurance Commission (IC) had 4 local scholars and no foreign scholarship recipient under Purisima. It had 5 local and 1 foreign scholar under Dominguez.

No employee so far at the Bureau of Local Government Finance (BLGF) has availed of either a local or foreign scholarship under Dominguez but there were 2 local and 3 foreign scholars under Purisima.

Deposit Insurance Corp. (PDIC) had 6 local scholars under Purisima and 5 so far under Dominguez. There were no foreign scholarship grantees from the PDIC in both administrations.

The Privatization and Management Office (PMO) has 1 local scholar so far under Dominguez and none under Purisima.

The National Tax Research Center (NTRC) had no local scholar but had 5 foreign scholars under Purisima and none so far under Dominguez.

The Government Service Insurance System (GSIS) so far has 1 local scholarship recipient and 1 foreign scholar under Dominguez.

The Social Security System (SSS) had 1 foreign scholar under Purisima and 5 local scholars under Dominguez.

A total of 666 employees of the DOF and its attached agencies have thus far been able to pursue further academic studies under Dominguez.

This figure represents an almost 41-percent increase from the 471 employees who were granted or able to secure scholarships under the previous Aquino administration. (PR)

Senator Win Gatchalian files his certificate of candidacy (COC) for another six-year term as a member of the upper chamber under the Nationalist People's Coalition (NPC).

Gatchalian, Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Basic Education, Arts and Culture, has been responsible for the enactment of landmark laws such as the Free Higher Education Act as he pushed for providing free tuition and other fees in state universities and colleges in the country;

Gatchalian oversaw the passage of the Alternative Learning System (ALS) Act for out-of-school youth, adults, and children in special extreme cases and the National Academy of Sports (NAS) for the next generation of Filipino athletes;

As Chairperson of the Energy Committee in the Senate, Gatchalian also pushed for the enactment of the Murang Kuryente Act which provides for a lower electricity rate, as well as the Lifeline Electricity Rate which subsidizes the electricity consumption of low-income households.

"After much thought, I decided to seek re-election in the May 9, 2022 elections. I deem it best to continue my work in the Senate," he said.

Gatchalian seeks another six-year term in the Senate

Gatchalian, Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Basic Education, Arts and Culture, has been responsible for the enactment of landmark laws such as the Free Higher Education Act as he pushed for providing free tuition and other fees in state universities and colleges in the country. Gatchalian oversaw the passage of the Alternative Learning System (ALS) Act for out-of-school youth, adults, and children in special extreme cases and the National Academy of Sports (NAS) for the next generation of Filipino athletes.

He also steered the passage into law of the Mobile Number Portability Act (MNPA) which allows mobile phone subscribers to switch network providers and keep their numbers for free and the Energy Virtual One-Stop Shop Act, a landmark anti-red tape measure streamlining the permitting process of power projects in the country. He's also behind Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act which advances energy efficiency and conservation practices in the country and provides tax incentives for energy-efficient projects.

As Chairperson of the Energy Committee in the Senate, Gatchalian also pushed for the enactment of the Murang Kuryente Act which provides for a lower electricity rate, as well as the Lifeline Electricity Rate which subsidizes the electricity consumption of

low-income households. Another notable legislation of Gatchalian is the establishment of the Philippine Energy Research and Policy Institute Act (PERPI), an all-in-one institution that enables the country to keep up with technological innovations and energy and policy research.

"Marami pang mga nakabinbing trabaho na kailangang pagtuunan ng pansin. Naniniwala akong mas kailangan ako sa lehislatura upang magbalangkas at magtulak ng mas marami pang mga batas patungo sa pagbangon ng bansa mula sa COVID-19 pandemic," Gatchalian said.

Gatchalian wants to oversee the passage into law of Senate Bill No. 1907, a measure that would institute services for learners with disabilities in support of inclusive education and the proposed "Teacher Education Excellence Act" which seeks to improve the quality of teacher education and training in the country. He also proposed a learning recovery program called the Academic Recovery and Accessible Learning (ARAL) which is meant to address learning losses because of prolonged school closures.

These, he said, are seen as some of the crucial steps to be able to restore normalcy in the basic education sector.

"I'm happy with the decision I've made. I ask and will work for your support," said Gatchalian.

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite: Congressional aspirants for the cities of Imus and General Trias and District 7 of Cavite province will have no opponent in the 2022 elections as the filing of certificates of candidacy (CoCs) ended on Friday.

The three unopposed congressional candidates in Cavite are Imus Councilor Adrian Jay Advincula, General Trias Mayor Antonio Ferrer and reelectionist Seventh District Rep. Crispin Jesus "Boying" Remulla.

Also running without opposition is Rep. Luis Ferrer 4th who is aiming for the mayoral post in General Trias. His running mate, Vice Mayor Jonas Labuguen, is also running unopposed.

Tagaytay City mayoral candidate Abraham "Bambol" Tolentino, reelectionist Vice Mayor Raymund Ambion and 10 councilors are also uncontested in the 2022 polls.

No challengers were listed for Tanza Mayor Yuri Pacumio and running mate Simon Matro, who are both seeking another term.

Candidates for

board member seats without challengers are Bacoor board member Edwin Malvar and newbie Bryan Revilla, eldest son of Sen. Ramon "Bong" Revilla Jr.; board member Kerby Salazar and Vice Mayor Maurito Sison of District 6. According to Atty. Margaret Reyes-Cortez, candidates who filed their respective CoCs in Cavite province have until November 8 to correct any errors on their CoCs. The deadline for switching of candidates is on November 15.

Meanwhile, Bacoor Mayor Lani Revilla, wife of Senator Revilla, and Jose Herminio Japson will vie for the congressional seat in the second district of Cavite.

Rep. Elpidio Barzaga of District 5 is running for reelection. He is being challenged by independent bet Osmundo Catupad of Dasmariñas.

Clashing for the congressional seat in District 8 are Tagaytay City Mayor Agnes Tolentino and independent bet Allan Par.

Cavite Gov. Juanito Victor "Jonvic" Remulla of National Uni-

ty Party is being challenged for his post by independent candidates Edwina Aguinaldo and Augusto Pera Jr.

Tagaytay Councilor Athena Tolentino, Remulla's running mate, will face independent bets Joseph Jamboy and Rolando Anacan Sr.

In the first district of Cavite, Vice Gov. Ramon "Jolo" Revilla 3rd, another son of Senator Revilla, is running against Dr. Paul Abaya, younger brother of First District Rep. Boy Blue Abaya, who is running for mayor against his second cousin, Kawit Mayor Angelo Aguinaldo.

Rosario Mayor Voltaire Ricafrente is being challenged by Vice Mayor Mao Luna, and Noveleta Mayor Dino Chua is running against former mayor Boy Alvarez.

In Cavite City the mayoral candidates are Denver Chua and Cavite City Association of Barangay Captains federation President Apple Paredes. (TMTIMES)

MANILA – The country's vaccination program must be kept off-limits from politicking, especially when the campaign period begins for the May 2022 elections.

National Task Force (NTF) Against Covid-19 chief implementer Secretary Carlito Galvez Jr. said on Friday political color has nothing to do with the distribution of vaccines.

"I enjoin all the governors and the mayors to unite. Huwag muna silang magkaroon ng tinatawag (Get rid of) political inclination and do not use this vaccination as a political weapon," Galvez said in an interview during the arrival of 2,793,240 doses of Moderna and AstraZeneca jabs at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport Terminal 1 in Parañaque City.

Galvez said expanding unity

and cooperation among local government units (LGUs) will further expedite the country's vaccination program.

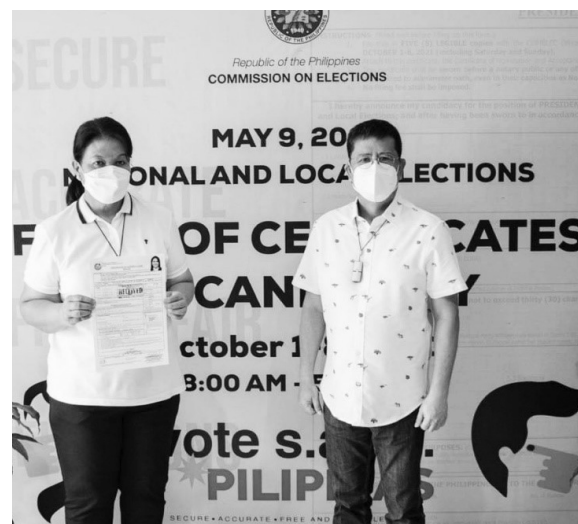
"They have to work as one and to vaccinate as one," he said.

With more vaccines coming in, Galvez encouraged LGUs to capacitate their towns and cities and actively promote the vaccination program against Covid-19.

He likewise assured equal distribution nationwide.

"Para mawala na 'yung tinatawag natin na political color, equitable na ang distribution natin hanggang municipality levels (To get rid of political color, we will have an equitable distribution of vaccine even at the municipality levels)," Galvez said.

The Philippines has so far received a total of 84,212,309 doses, to date. (PNA)

Tatakbo muli bilang Senador si dating Speaker Alan Peter Cayetano sa paparating na halalan. Sa isang press conference noong ika-7 ng Oktubre, 2021 sa Senator Renato L. Cayetano Memorial Science and Technology High School, sinabi ni Cayetano na nais niyang isulong ang isang faith-based at values-centered na pamumuno sa gitna ng kasalukuyang pandemya.

"It is that spirit that I feel I will be able to contribute and help if I run again for the Senate or to run as Senator for the Republic of the Philippines," aniya.

Noong unang araw ng Oktubre, matakbo ang ilang buwan ng pagninilay-nilay ukol sa kanyang desisyon na tumakbo bilang Pangulo, in-annunyo ng mambabatas na hindi na niya ito itutuloy upang hindi lalong magkawatak-watak ang mga mamamayan.

"Yes, it's 100 percent true na yung mga advocacies natin ay sure nating magagawa if ang tatakbohin natin ay pagka-Pangulo. But the reality is napaka-divisive na," wika niya.

Ipinaliwanag niya sa kanyang press conference na hindi naimpluwensyahan ng mga presidential at senatorial survey ang kanyang desisyon.

"The surveys are only a picture of what's happening today, not tomorrow. Having said that, the reality is yung tumatakbo ka kasi may magagawa ka pag nanalo ka. So kung wala kang maki-

tang path to victory doon, sinasayang mo lang oras mo," sabi ni Cayetano.

Sinabi rin ng dating Speaker na dumidistansya na siya mula sa partidong Nacionalista at tatakbo siya bilang isang independent na kandidato.

"Walang partido muna. I think it's really a time for national unity. So, high level, nag-uusap na ang lahat ng partido at marami pa rin ang nalilito kung sino ang admin, sino ang magkasama. Bilang isang tao na matagal nang nalilito, ayaw kong lituhin pa lalo ang sarili ko," aniya.

Unang nahalal si Cayetano bilang Senador noong 2007 at natalaga bilang pinuno ng makapangyarihang Senate Blue Ribbon Committee, kung saan pinamunuan niya ang mga imbestigasyon ukol sa kontrobersyal na NBN-ZTE deal at Fertilizer Fund Scam.

Sa kanyang ikalawang termino bilang Senador, nahalal siya bilang Senate Majority Floor Leader at pinuno ng Senate Committee on Rules, pati ng mga kumite sa ethics and privileges, foreign relations, at agrarian reform. Peacemaker Bilang isang kandidato sa pagka-senador, sinabi ni Cayetano na pagsisikapan niyang makatrabaho ang bawat kandidato sa pagka-pangulo sa paglikha ng isang post-pandemic recovery plan.

"I know, mas kilala niyo si Alan na fiscalizer. Mas kilala niyo si Alan na pag mali, mali. Pag tama, tama. Di po magbabago 'yon. Ang magbabago

lang po, I will try to be the peacemaker and try to bring the presidentiables together," sabi ni Cayetano.

Sa kasalukuyan, tinatapos ng dating Speaker ang kanyang five-year recovery plan.

"Hopefully po, maging open-minded yung iba't ibang presidentiables sa five-year plan," sabi niya.

"Basically, it talks about paradigm shifts. Yung baguhin na natin yung mindset ng Pilipino na ang pweede lang yumaman ay iilan lang. Dapat yung social mobility, yung opportunity, lahat dapat meron," dagdag pa ni Cayetano.

Bukod sa five-year plan, sinabi ni Cayetano na patuloy niyang itutulak ang 10K Ayuda Bill sa mga kasamahan niyang tatakbo rin sa pagka-senador sa 2020 halalan.

"We're not giving up on it this Congress pa lang. Di ko hihintayin kung papalarin, kung sa awa ng Diyos ay aabot sa Senate," aniya.

Dagdag pa ni Cayetano, mayroon na rin siyang nakumbinsing mga kapwa kongresista upang suportahan ang panukalang ito.

Tugon ni Cayetano sa mga nagtatanong kung sino ang susuportahan niyang kandidato sa pagka-Pangulo, sinabi niya na balak niya muna silang tanungin ukol sa kanilang posisyon sa iba't ibang issues tulad ng West Philippine Sea, pag-susugal, at 10K economic stimulus. (PR)

BOC ...

The Bureau of Customs (BOC) has donated mobile phones, laptops, educational materials and other seized goods to the Department of Education (DepEd) and other government agencies, in compliance with the instructions of Finance Secretary Carlos Dominguez III.

In a report to Dominguez, the BOC said that from March 2020 to August 2021, the Bureau also turned over abandoned or confiscated broadcasting equipment, food items, temporary shelters, face shields and various medical supplies and equipment to government agencies where these goods will be put to good use.

Turned over by the BOC to the DepEd were assorted cellular phones and laptops from the Port of Clark in Pampanga on Jan. 29; and learning packets for learners from the port of the Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA) on March 16, Customs Commissioner Rey Leonardo Guerrero said in his report.

"Rest assured that the process of donation and turnover of the items for donation are being expedited in compliance with existing laws, rules and regulations," Guerrero said.

Guerrero said the BOC donated to the Presidential Communications Operations Office (PCOO) abandoned

broadcast equipment from the Port of Davao on Oct. 20, 2020, and another 17 packages of live broadcasting room equipment with FM broadcast transmitter last July 27.

The BOC is also set to turn over a separate set of live broadcast room equipment and medium wave transmitter abandoned in the Port of Cebu to the PCOO.

From the Port of Manila, the BOC donated to the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) 40 boxes of face shields that were turned over on July 14 2021 and a 40-foot container of Libby's Vienna Sausage turned over on May 1, 2020.

Also turned over to the DSWD were 10 boxes of assorted apparel from the Port of Iloilo last March 7, 2020; 10 packages of canvas tents, with accessories and 2 units of stretch tents from the NAIA, on Aug. 27 this year.

Guerrero said the BOC is also in the process of turning over to the Department of Health (DOH) about 11,500 face shields; 7,000 pieces of surgical face masks; 19,000 pieces of children's disposable face masks; and 12,000 pieces of disposable adult face masks that were seized in the Port of Manila.

The North Luzon Regional Office of the National Commission on Muslim Filipinos (NCMF) was the recipient last Aug. 13 of a 20-foot container of Muslim books seized from the Port of Subic, while the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) received 16 20-foot containers of twine, yarn droppings and cuttings on Aug. 13 from the Port of Cebu.

Nine 40-foot containers and one 20-foot container of steel beams and accessories, 487 pieces of coated pipes and uncoated pipe tubes, 35 40-foot containers and a 20-foot container of steel parts seized in the Port of Subic were initially turned over by the BOC to the Department of Transportation (DOTr), but is now in the process of being transferred to the Philippine Navy (PN), Guerrero said.

Guerrero said the BOC will also turn over to the Navy 3 20-foot empty containers located in the Port of Batangas.

Eight drums of oil seized in the Port of Surigao will be turned over to the Surigao city government, he said.

Various undeclared bathroom items seized in the Port of Iloilo are set to be donated by the BOC to the Iloilo city government once the latter has completed the processes required for the turnover.

Guerrero said the Lapu-lapu city government is also set to receive 32 20-foot containers of twine, yarn droppings and cuttings from the Port of Cebu; and the Mandaue city government, 12 20-foot containers of the same materials.

The DSWD Central Visayas Field Office is also the recipient of 4 20-foot containers of twine, yarn droppings and cuttings that were also forfeited by the consignee and left in the Port of Cebu.

Sari-Saring Pag-asa: Cayetano relaunches financial aid program sari-sari store owners

Calling sari-sari stores one of the "best training centers" for budding business owners, former House Speaker Alan Peter Cayetano on Tuesday relaunched the Sari-Sari Store Community, this time calling it "Sari-Saring Pag-Asa," a financial assistance program for sari-sari store owners.

During the program's pilot episode on his official Facebook page on August 31, 2021, Cayetano said the cash aid that sari-sari store owners will receive from the Sari-Saring Pag-Asa initiative can be used to support both their daily needs and their small businesses.

"That's why we're giving you P3,500, para yung P1,000 (ay) magamit niyo sa mga immediate needs niyo. Then, yung P2,500, magamit niyo para i-replenish, i-restock ang (inyong) sari-sari store," he said.

(That's why we're giving you P3,500. You can use P1,000 for your immediate needs. You can use the remaining P2,500 to replenish or restock your sari-sari stores.)



"Ang sari-sari store ay isa sa mga best training centers sa pagnenegosyo," he added.

(The sari-sari store is one of the best training centers for doing business.

Sari-Saring Pag-asa takes off from the Taguig-Pa-

teros (TaPat) Sari-Store Program created by Taguig 2nd District Rep. Lani Cayetano to provide financial assistance and livelihood training for sari-sari store owners in Taguig and Pateros.

Through the program, sari-sari store owners in Taguig and Pateros received around P2,500-P3,500 each.

"Ang ginawa po ni Lani, bumili ng P2,500 worth of goods at nakita po namin na hindi man punong-puno ang sari-sari store mo, kahit papaano, may mabebenta ka na," the former Speaker said.

(Lani bought P2,500 worth of goods and we realized that while it may not be enough to fill a sari-sari store, one will still have something to sell.)

The local initiative was later expanded into the Sari-Sari Store Community, a national program that sought to create a community of sharing and mutual aid among sari-sari store owners from different parts of the country.

"We made it a community kasi ang community po, nagdadamay," Cayetano said.

(We made it a community because people help each other when they are gathered as a community.

Prior to Tuesday's episode, the Sari-Sari Store Community program had already reached more than 1,700 sari-sari store owners from Baguio City, Dagupan City, Olongapo City, the towns of Guiguinto of Calumpit in Bulacan, and Calocan City.

As of August 31, 2021, the Cayetanos have extended aid to a total of 2,018 sari-sari store owners from different parts of the country.

The Sari-Saring Pag-Asa program will complement their weekly Sampung Libong Pag-Asa initiative, which took off from the advocacy of the 10K Ayuda Bill.

The Cayetanos and their allies filed the 10K Ayuda Bill on February 1, 2021 with the aim of expanding the government's economic stimulus program. The proposed measure seeks to distribute P10,000 each among the country's poorest households. (PR)
