<u>EDITUKYAL:</u> The young are in peril

Thirty-one percent of Filipino girls and young women are not sure how to spot disinformation online, and 6 percent cannot tell whether the information they see online is true at all, a survey by Plan International revealed.

Nearly a third of the 1,000 respondents say they spent more than 12 hours online.

Moreover, 38 percent of girls and young women have been led to believe a myth about COVID-19, and 35 percent have questioned whether they should get vaccinated.

Thirty-one percent of the 1,000 respondents say mistruths have been so dominant that they have doubted election results, while one in five have stopped engaging in politics or current affairs alto-

lives, and 20 percent feel physically unsafe because of false information on the internet, the study said. One in three young women says false information is affecting her mental health — they feel stressed, worried and anxious.

The survey also revealed that lies found online have a profound impact on how young people engage with a myriad of issues, from COVID-19 to politics.

All of these underscored the need for governments to ramp up educating the youth on how to receive information they get from the internet.

Perhaps the government, as well as the private sector, civil society, communities and families

It is at least a consolation that girls and young women are aware that the internet brings a different kind of danger during this information age, and that these are not at all harmless — they can do damage both physically and psychologically.

Advances in technology have made coping with restrictions brought about by the pandemic easier. If unchecked, however, the danger especially to impressionable young people could be devastating.

Adults should eschew the notion that social media and the internet are the domain of the young. They should step up and be familiar with what their children are up to so they can guide and protect them—online and offline.

Secretary Carlos Dominguez III has ordered the Department of Finance (DOF), its attached agencies and state corporations to prepare their respective plans on transitioning work back to their respective office, with strict adherence to health and safety protocols, after more than a year of shifting to work-fromhome (WFH) arrangements because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Dominguez said that as more government employees get fully vaccinated, the DOF and its agencies such as the Bureaus of Customs (BOC), of Internal Revenue (BIR), of Local Government Finance (BLGF) and of the Treasury (BTr); Insurance Commission (IC), Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), and other attached organizations should gradually shift to working normally in their respective offices.

The transition plans, Dominguez said, should include testing protocols for employees and their immediate families, and seminars to educate them on how to return safely to full-time office work.

"I think that we should already have a plan for transitioning back into working normally. In other words, back-to-office work," Dominguez said during a recent executive committee (Execom) meeting for other attached agencies and state-run corporations under the DOF.

Converge will utilize the credit support from LANDBANK for its continued network expansion across the country, broadening its distribution reach, and boosting international connectivity.

The total loan package from LANDBANK will also include an additional short term loan line as well as a facility for its trade transactions amounting to up to P2 billion.

In line with servicing the emerging needs of its clients in the new normal, LANDBANK successfully facilitated 73.5 million transactions amounting to P1.307 trillion through its five major e-banking channels from January to July 2021. This represented comparative year-on-year increases of 12% and 65%, respectively.

As of July 2021, the Bank has also facilitated the opening of more than 1.7 million online accounts through its Digital On-boarding System or DOBS which digitizes the submission of account applications.

LANDBANK also launched recently the DOBS Mobile which facilitates online savings account opening in as fast as 10 to 15 minutes. The LANDBANK DOBS Mobile eliminates the need to line up in branches to open an account, in support of the National Government's Ease of Doing Business (EODB) initiative, as well as safety protocols imposed to limit COVID-19 infections.

DILG Undersecretary Ricojudge Echiverri assured lawmakers that the department will work with the DepEd to speed up the inoculation of teachers;

To complete the vaccination of teachers, Undersecretary Malaluan also assured the Senate panel that the DepEd will pursue an institutional approach to vaccination and work with the National Task Force (NTF) Against COVID-19;

The vaccination of the general population has been scheduled to start this month.

Cayetano ...

House Former Speaker Alan Peter Cavetano on Tuesday urged Filipinos to continue praying for the government, especially that the country's leaders would see the need to provide direct stimulus to families and small businesses.

"Ipag-pray po talaga natin na ang gobyerno will see the wisdom na lahat ng pamilyang Pilipino at mga micro-enterprise o maliliit na negosyo ay bigyan ng 10K," Cayetano said during the live stream of the Sari-saring Pag-asa program on October 19, 2021.

(Let's pray that the aovernment will see the wisdom that lies in our efforts to push for the P10,000 direct stimulus package both for Filipino families and micro-enterprises.)

Cayetano and his allies in the Balik sa Tamang Serbisyo (BTS) sa Kongreso have been pushing for the 10K Avuda Bill which seeks to provide every Filipino family with P10,000 in direct aid to help them with their daily needs as well as put up their own small businesses. The proposed

measure was filed in February and was consolidated into Bayanihan 3, but the provision of P10,000 for every family was not adopted. This prompted

Cayetano and his allies to launch the Sampung Libong Pag-asa program which provides P10,000 in cash aid to selected beneficiaries.

They also spearheaded the Sari-saring Pagasa program which provides P3,500 in assistance to sari-sari store owners so they can increase the items they

sell In the latest episode of the program, 75 new beneficiaries were given financial assistance. bringing the total to over 4.400

'Always be happy' Tuesday's episode featured the story of Quezon

City resident Rachel Ann Natino, who was selected as beneficiary on August 8, 2021.

With the P3,500 cash aid she received, Natino was able to stock up on her store's supply of food, shampoo, and soap. She even added soft drinks and snacks to her inventory which sell easily within her community.

"Ito po kasi y'ung mabilis na mabenta, pagkain po kasi lahat po at saka ginagamit sa pangaraw-araw," Natino shared in a prerecorded video.

(These items are usually the fastest commodity to sell because they are for everyday use.)

Natino also shared pieces of advice to fellow sari-sari store owners who are similarly situated.

"Sa mga kagaya ko po na nagtitinda, kailangan po magaling lang po kavo makisama sa inyong mga customer arawaraw... Bawal po kasi masungit dito sa aming tindahan. Lagi pong dapat masaya," she said.

(To those like me, we need to build good rapport with our customers. Let's avoid making customers feel uncomfortable. Let's always be hap-

Accelerate COVID-19 vaccination of teachers with face-to-face classes pilot run

eyes to start the pilot test of limited face-to-face classes in 120 schools on November 15.

In a Senate panel hearing on preparations for limited face-to-face classes, DepEd Undersecretary Nepomuceno Malaluan reported that 57% of teachers are already vaccinated, which is equivalent to more than 580,000 of around 970,000 teachers and non-teaching personnel.

"I know that some LGUs are partnering with their local districts or their local divisions to prioritize teachers. The DILG can play a very big role in encouraging or even pushing for these partnerships," said Gatchalian, Chairman of the Senate Committee on Basic Education, Arts and Culture.

DILG Undersecretary Ricojudge Echiverri assured lawmakers that the department will work with the DepEd to speed up the inoculation of teachers. The DILG official added that the department will consolidate LGUs' data on the COVID-19 vaccination coverage of teachers which will be reconciled with DepEd's figures.

To complete the vaccination of teachers, Undersecretary Malaluan also assured the Senate panel that the DepEd will pursue an institutional approach to vaccination and work with the National Task Force (NTF) Against COVID-19. Teachers are included in the A4 priority list of the COVID-19 vaccination program.

'Even though the teacher wants to be in the school but cannot get access to the vaccines because there is no prioritization, then it's not the fault of the teacher that he or she cannot get access to the vaccines. So, the point is to give special priority to our teachers because the push here is to go back to faceto-face classes," said Gatchalian.

As of October 10, 49.6 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines were already administered, according to the National Covid-19 vaccination dashboard and 85.5 million vaccine doses have been delivered to the country as of October 9. The vaccination of the general population has been scheduled to start this month.







ACKNOWLEDGING the importance for the private sector to work hand-in-hand with the government in mitigating the effects of the coronavirus pandemic on the country, Go Negosyo and OCTA Research on Tuesday formalized their partnership through a memorandum of understanding (MoU) to better guide business industries in navigating the economy amid the crisis.

Led by Malacañang Adviser for Entrepreneurship and Go Negosyo founder Jose Maria 'Joey' Concepcion 3rd and OCTA Research head Ranjit Rye, the virtual signing of the MoU highlighted efforts between the two groups to wield more cemented guidelines in making key decisions to help micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) stay afloat amid the Covid-19 crisis.

Under the agreement, OCTA Research will serve as Go Negosyo's advisory team regarding analysis of all Covid-19 related numbers, including new daily cases, reproduction number, hospital utilization, vaccination data and other relevant items.

They will also combine efforts to create strategies and proposals for further reopening of the economy that is data-driven and scientific to add to already existing information related to the Philippines' pandemic response as well as employ other learning and capacity building efforts.

Concepcion cited Go Negosyo and OCTA Research's intensive consultation last August, when infections of the virus' Delta variant were continuing to increase in numbers, which resulted in the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases imposing another two-week hard lockdown.

According to the Palace adviser, who then was also in discussions with National Task Force Against Covid-19 chief implementer and vaccine czar Secretary Carlito Galvez Jr. and leaders of various local government units, the decision was based on data provided by the independent research group that the spike in cases will eventually see a dramatic decline by October.

'For several weeks, Go Negosyo and OCTA Research have partnered in providing valuable and useful Covid-19 data for the perusal and consideration of both government and private stakeholders,' Concepcion said.

He added that the partnership is a commitment and advocacy of the two groups to deliver a more data-based means of helping the business sector and even the national government in determining courses of action as the country is slowly but steadily learning 'to live with Covid-19.'

With the current downward trend of cases, OCTA Research raised the possibility that Metro Manila could be placed under Alert Level 2 starting next month.

With this, Concepcion said they hope for a faster mass vaccination rollout by the government, citing an ample stockpile of the country's anti-coronavirus jabs that 'will save the fourth quarter' for the Philippine economy.

Having a bigger percentage of the population inoculated, he added, means more businesses opening up and generating employment just in time for the Christmas season.

'More capacity for businesses in the last quarter of the year will enable them to recoup losses from the lockdown and allow them to gain momentum for next year's operation,' Concepcion said.

He noted that business groups are ramping up efforts to have their employees vaccinated not just to protect their clients and customers but more importantly their families.

'Having all of our workers vaccinated against Cpvid-19 will also contribute to the safe reopening of our economy that we are all hoping for in the last quarter of the year,' Concepcion said. (TMTIMES)
