EDITORIAL:

Surveys as signs of our times

There are several ways to look at popularity surveys, such as the one conducted in November and which results were recently released by Pulse Asia. In that poll, the top four officials of the land suffered decreases in trust and approval from the public, some more than others.

One way to look at the surveys is that it is but a snapshot of the sentiments of the people at any given time. Data on the people's preferences were gathered between November 26 and December 3. Events during this time certainly affected people's trust and approval of their leaders - specifically, the fallout of the congressional hearings on confidential funds, threats made against high-profile personalities, the filing of impeachment complaints against the Vice President, the defiant stance of the former President regarding the war on drugs, among others. Impact of the counter accusations were felt by other officials as well.

Another way to perceive the dip in ratings is that they indicate that the people want more from their officials more than the usual infighting with political enemies - even those they swore they would be united with just two years prior. It is the sign of an enlightened electorate that they should demand action on gut issues, instead of personality-based distractions in the form of sound bytes and controversial pronouncements.

But it is also an option for officials to dismiss the negative developments and focus on their jobs - their real jobs, apart from gaining public approval that would translate into the next election season. There are projects to be implemented and laws to pass, and it could be said real governance involves making unpopular decisions that are good in the long term but that could cost an official popularity in the immediate term. If this is the case, then a real leader would not mind shedding a few points if it meant something for the greater good.

Then again, who are we kidding? What the latest popularity numbers tell us, the people, is that ultimately we do have a say on which officials to install in power, and that our opinion does matter. It would be foolhardy, then, to think that we could just go with what the masses like, because everyone is part of the masses. Ultimately, the collective voice could teach our officials lessons and give them reminders on how to do their jobs.

This Christmas, may we work on honing this voice, so that our opinion and perception are informed by facts interpreted under the right context, ethical and moral considerations, historical accuracy, and plain common sense.

This is how public sentiment becomes formidable. This is the best gift we can give our nation

Joining Concepcion and the First Lady were Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Sec. Cris Roque, Department of Migrant Workers (DMW) Sec. Hans Leo Cacdac, Commission on Filipinos Overseas Chairman Dante "Klink" Ang, and Pasay City Mayor Emi Calixto-Rubiano. DMW Sec. Cacdac thanked Go Negosyo for

organizing the event. "Today is about creating opportunities for collaborations, and to uplift not only OFWs and their families but also the entire Filipino people," he said.

He shared that the DMW supports the reintegration of OFWs back into the country through programs for continuous learning and help them re-tool and upskill. GSIS Hosts Project HUB year-end meet

The Government Service Insurance System (GSIS) hosted a quadripartite meeting on December 18, bringing together officials from the Department of Transportation (DOTR), Metropolitan Manila Development Authority (MMDA), and the Quezon City Local Government Unit (LGU) to dis-

cuss milestones reached towards the realization of the Project HUB proposal, including the next steps for the coming year 2025. Representatives from the Presidential Management Staff (PMS) were also in attendance to oversee the President's instruction.

Project HUB is the proposed intermodal transport facility expected to rise on a 3-hectare GSIS property in Quezon City by 2026. It is a directive from President Ferdinand Marcos Jr., who has prioritized innovative infrastructure solutions to address Metro Manila's worsening traffic condition and improve connectivity.

Presided over by GSIS President and General Manager Wick Veloso, the meeting highlighted the collaborative efforts of four government entities to ease traffic concerns, enhance mobility, and support economic development in Quezon City and nearby areas. Aside from Veloso, MMDA

Chairman Romando Artes, DOTR ASEC Leonel Cray De Velez, Presidential Management Staff Director Joanna Micah Eufemio, and representatives from the Quezon City local government unit, including Assistant City Administrator Alberto Kimpo and City Planning Head Dr. Jose Edgardo Gomez Jr. joined the year-end.

"Guided by President Marcos' directive, we have a unique opportunity to transform the GSIS Quezon City property into a strategic transportation hub that will improve daily commutes, addressing mobility issues with innovative, inclusive and sustainable solutions," Veloso said.

The agenda included updates on the Project HUB's Terms of

Reference from the DOTR and exchanges among stakeholders to refine the project's details to include the immediate operation of a temporary transport facility by next year while the more detailed study and plan for the permanent transportation hub is being done.

"Collaboration is the foundation for this very important project. Together, we are not just building a transport hub - we are laying the groundwork for progress and drive our nation forward," Veloso added.

The meeting concluded with all parties reaffirming their commitment to advancing the project as it aligns with the administration's vision of sustainable and innovative infrastructure solutions sooner rather than later.

Sailing home for the holidays: Gatchalian champions protections for PH seafarers

As Filipino seafarers return home for the Christmas holidays, Senator Win Gatchalian highlighted the importance of the Magna Carta for Filipino seafarers in providing enhanced protection and ensuring a safer, more secure working environment for these maritime workers.

"It is undeniable that Filipino seafarers play a crucial role in our country's economic growth. They are the lifeline of our maritime industry. We pushed for the enactment of this measure as the government must continuously nurture, protect, and guide our seafarers. Mechanisms must be in place to safeguard their well-being, safety, and fair treatment, wherever they may sail," Gatchalian said.

Data from the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) reveals the economic contribution of sea-based Filipino workers. In October this year alone, overseas Filipino seafarers sent home cash remittances amounting to USD 602.35 million. From January to October 2024, their total remittances reached USD 5.69 billion, marking a 14% growth compared to the USD 5.61 billion recorded for the same period in 2023.

The President signed RA 12021, or An Act Providing for the Magna Carta of Filipino Seafarers, in September this year. Gatchalian, a co-author of the measure, expressed optimism about its benefits. "With the signing of this measure, Filipino seamen will now enjoy better protection. This will help them improve their work efficiency and enhance their competitiveness on the global stage," Gatchalian said.

With the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) out soon, the law demonstrates the country's commitment to upholding international maritime safety standards with a particular emphasis on enhancing the training and accreditation processes for Filipino seafarers, he added.

The senator explained that the law seeks to ensure that Filipino seafarers would have the right to a safe and secure workplace that complies with safety standards, fair terms and conditions of employment, decent working and living conditions on board a ship, and appropriate medical care for both overseas and domestic seafarers.

Between 2016 and 2021, the Philippines deployed over 400,000 Filipino seafarers, reflecting the country's strong maritime heritage. Further, it is estimated that there is one Filipino seafarer for every 4 to 5 crew members on board a vessel at any given time. The COVID-19 caused a 54% decline in seafarer deployments in 2020, but deployment levels bounced back in 2021, averaging around 4,000 monthly – approaching pre-pandemic figures.

ZERO GOV'T SUBSIDY FOR PHILHEALTH INJUSTICE TO FILIPINOS, FAST-TRACK HEALTH BENEFIT INCREASES – LEE

"Kung may malinaw na plano at nagagamit agad ang pondo para sa dagdag-benefisyong hindi sana zero ang subsidy."

This was the statement of Manoy Wilbert "Wise" Lee as he slammed the Department of Health (DOH) over the recent removal of government subsidy for Philippine Health Insurance (PhilHealth) in the 2025 National Budget.

"Ang sinasabing dahilan ng zero subsidy ay dahil marami pang pondo ang PhilHealth.

Pero para sa atin, hindi ito 'excess funds' kundi 'unused funds'--pondo ito na dapat napakinabangan na ng mga Pilipino. Yung subsidy na ipinagkait para sa susunod na taon, ay mailalapa na sana sa mga serbisyo para sa mas nangangailangan nating mga kababayan," Lee said during the House Committee on Good Government and Public Accountability on Tuesday.

"Nung nakaraang taon pa natin inexpose na nasa mahigit 500 billion pesos o kalahating trilyon ang nakatengga sa bangko ng PhilHealth, na dapat gamitin ito agad sa pagpapalawak ng benepisyo. Pero anong nangyari? Napakakapad ng implementasyon. Ano ba talagang rason ng delay?"

"Di ko matanggap na wala tayong paraan para bilisan ito. Kailangan ba araw-araw kayo mag-meeting para magawa ito? A little more patience? Anong kapalit, more pa-

tients dying? Kung lagi na lang magtititi sa napakabagal na dagdag na benepisyo, baka lagi nang ma-zero ang subsidy ng PhilHealth," the solon from Bicol added.

Citing the commitments he sealed with DOH and PhilHealth during the House Budget Deliberations last September 25, Lee underscored the urgent need to use the available funds of PhilHealth to provide quality health services for Filipinos, especially the vulnerable sectors.

"Sa bilyon-bilyong halaga na meroon ang PhilHealth at sa dapat na naipagkaloob na subsidy, marami nating mga kababayan ang pwedeng masagot na ang PET scan, CT scan, MRI, at mababawasan ang gastos sa pagpapa-ospital, lalo na sa pagpapagamot ng mga mabibigat na karamdaman," the lawmaker said.

"Oktubre pa natin hiningi sa DOH, sa kasunduan na pinirmahan mismo ni Sec. Ted Herbosa, na pinresenta natin sa Kongreso, ang komprehensibong plano para sa pagpapababa ng gastos ng Pilipino sa pagpapa-ospital. Pero wala man lang siyang paramdam sa atin. Kung may kongkretong sanang plano kung saan gagamitin ang pondo, mas maipaglalaban pa natin ang subsidiya para sa PhilHealth."

"Nasaan ang hustisya kung sa pagka-manhid at kapalpakan ng ilang namumuno, mi-

lyon-milyong Pilipino ang magdurusa at mapagkakaitan ng dagdag na benepisyon pangkalusugan? Kaya ang panawagan natin, magbitiw na si Sec. Herbosa kung siya rin lang naman ang nagpapabalag sa pagpapatupad ng mga benepisyon karapatan at deserve ng ating mga kababayan," Lee earlier stated.

Through Lee's secured commitments, PhilHealth Board recently approved the following:

- Free eye check-up and free eyeglasses, including free operation for cataract
- Expanded PhilHealth coverage for heart procedures
- Expanded emergency care benefit package
- 50% increase in PhilHealth benefits on some case rates

A staunch health advocate, the Bicolano lawmaker is also instrumental in the 30% increase of PhilHealth benefits implemented last February 2024. PhilHealth's benefit package for hemodialysis was also expanded from P2,600 to P6,350 per session and from 90 sessions per year to 156 sessions annually, as well as the breast cancer treatment coverage which increased from P100,000 to P1.4 million.

"Sa kabila ng

mga dagdag benepisyonang ito, kulang na kulang pa ito. Hindi pwedeng tingi-tingi pa rin ang serbisyo lalo na sa kalusugan ng ating mga kababayan. Pwede ba natin sabihin sa mga kababayan natin na 'wag muna silang magkasakit, na 'wag muna silang magpa-opera kasi hinihintay pang madagdagan 'yung sasagutin ng PhilHealth?' Lee asked.

"Marami ang pinipili na lang maratay sa bahay sa kabila ng karamdaman, sa takot na malubog lalo sa utang at kahirapan at maging pagbigat pa sa kanilang mga mahal sa buhay. Kung magpapatuloy ang zero subsidy dahil sa kawalan o mabagal na benefit enhancement funds ng PhilHealth, di maibibigay sa mga Pilipino ang nararapat na kalinga. Without a clear and actionable plan and clear coordination between the DOH and PhilHealth, we are simply perpetuating a broken system that will prolong the suffering of our countrymen."

"Ang layunin natin: ang gamot at pagpapagamot, dapat libre na, sagot na ng gobyerno. Wag tayong gumawa ng mga polisiya na pauring, kundi palapit sa katuparan ng mga nararapat na serbisyo para sa mga Pilipino," he concluded. PR
