bringing SMC's total trees planted in the area to 4,600. Mount Purro is part of the Sierra Madre mountain range and helps protect Metro Manila and Rizal from flooding.

At the same site last year, trees planted by SMC volunteers recorded an 80% survival rate.

"Tree planting, when done consistently and at scale, makes a big difference. I'm grateful to our people for continuing to take part in this effort," said SMC President and CEO Ramon S. Ang.

For the rest of the year, SMC has scheduled 21 volunteer-led activations involving 1,351 employee volunteers who are expected to contribute over 4,000 hours planting at least 7,675 seedlings across multiple

These employee-led efforts complement SMC's larger reforestation program, including San Miguel Global Power's Project 747, which has already planted over 6.5 million trees and mangroves in various forestlands and coastal areas in the country, with a survival rate of 91% for upland trees and 89% for mangrove propagules. The project is now on track to exceed its original target of planting 7 million trees over 7 years, covering both land and coastal ecosystems.

In addition to planting activities, SMC's San Miguel Properties Inc. (SMPI) has pledged to donate 80,000 seedlings to support reforestation in Bataan.

Is the Ombudsman serious in probe of VP Sara?

Last week, the Office of the Ombudsman ordered Vice President Sara Duterte and nine others from the Department of Education and the Office of the Vice President to respond to charges filed by the House of Representatives related to the alleged misuse of confidential funds.

Duterte and the other respondents were given 10 days upon receiving the order to file their counter-affidavit. These must be filed with the affidavits of their witnesses, as well as other supporting documents.

"Failure to file counter-affidavit within the aforesaid period shall be deemed as a waiver of respondents' right to submit controverting evidence, and the preliminary investigation shall proceed accordingly," the order read.

The Ombudsman emphasized it would not entertain any motion to dismiss or motion for bill of particulars

The order followed a House complaint: against the Vice President and others earlier this week for technical malversation, falsification, use of falsified documents, perjury, bribery, corruption of public officers, plunder, and betraval of public trust and culpable violation of the Constitution.

That's a whole raft of serious charges against Vice President Sara Duterte that would make her face jail time if she is found guilty.

That would be in contrast with the Senate impeachment trial whereshe would only be removed from office and face perpetual disqualification from public office if convicted by two-thirds of the members of the impeachment court.

But wait

There are questions being raised as to the propriety of the Ombudsman conducting a probe of the alleged misuse by the Office of the Vice President at this time when the Senate impeachment trial is also targeted to commence by July once the 20th Congress starts its sessions.

While the Ombudsman probe will result: in the filing of charges before the Sandiganbayan, what if it results in the dismissal of the charges against the Vice President?

And how would this affect the verdict of the Senate impeachment court?

It is feared that if the Ombudsman dismisses the charges against the Vice President for one reason or another, this could pull the rug from under the feet of the Senate impeachment court and give the senator-judges ample reason to similarly dismiss outright the impeachment complaint

Or could it be possibly part of the playbook of the pro-Duterte forces to use the Ombudsman who after all was appointed to his former position as Associate Justice of the Supreme Court by then President Rodrigo Duterte – to have the serious cases against her to be dismissed so she can be a formidable candidate for the highest elective position in 2028?

Gatchalian: EOPT Law Among 19th Congress' Biggest Triumphs

As the Senate prepares legislative measures for the upcoming 20th Congress, Senator Win Gatchalian emphasized that making tax compliance simpler and more efficient was among his office's most significant achievements in the 19th Congress.

The Ease of Paying Tax (EOPT) law, enacted in January 2024 streamlines the process for taxpavers to comply with their tax obligations. "Pinasimple natin ang proseso ng pagbabayad ng buwis upang mas mapalakas din ang tax compliance ng ating mga kababayan at mapataas ang kita ng gobyerno," said Gatchalian, principal author and sponsor of Republic Act 11976 or the EOPT Act.

The law introduced the file-and-pay-anywhere system, allowing most of the tax processes to be accomplished through online channels. It also mandated a shift to an invoice system to improve the registration process and accelerate the processing of value-added tax (VAT) refunds.
