

MPTC Promotes Responsible Driving Through Mission Road Safety BiyaHero Caravan

Metro Pacific Tollways Corporation (MPTC), together with its subsidiaries NLEX Corporation and MPT South, reinforced its commitment to safer roads by bringing together national government agencies, local government units, transport groups, and private sector partners for the “Mission Road Safety BiyaHero Caravan.” The program aims to enhance the practical skills, safety alertness, and responsible driving culture of drivers and operators.

EDITORIAL:
The reckoning

THE impeachment ball rolled out Monday from the House of Representatives, with the flag speeding alongside it with focus on accountability and rule of law.

That ball is now in the Senate hall, which interestingly changed leadership minutes before the 255 yes votes were cast against 26 no and nine abstentions – with 24-member Senate sitting as the impeachment judges.

The charges include misuse of confidential funds, unexplained wealth, and alleged threats against President Marcos.

They highlight the legal process over political standing and focus on the repeated nature of the charges, and when confidential funds met public scrutiny.

The margin of votes was heard and watched by millions, north and south of the capital, to send articles of impeachment against Vice President Sara Duterte to the Senate, throwing her announced 2028 presidential run in a legal and Constitutional zone of doubt.

Under the 1987 Constitution, an impeachment triggers a Senate trial. A guilty verdict there would see Duterte removed from office and barred from elected office for life.

Filipinos will be watching how the Senate, with its new leadership, will act on the impeachment complaints.

Senator Alan Peter Cayetano, who served as then president Rodrigo Duterte's foreign secretary, replaced Vicente Sotto III as Senate president after a 13-9 vote, with two abstentions.

Filipinos including political and election observers will be watching keenly if the change in Senate leadership could play a significant role in the outcome of the attempt to impeach the vice president.

The House committee on justice chairman Gerville Luistro sponsored the impeachment complaint before the votes were counted, underlining process and evidence.

The plenary discussions focussed on the four consolidated Articles of Impeachment adopted by the Justice panel after combining similar allegations from the Saballa and Cabrera impeachment complaints.

The first article involves the alleged misuse and irregular disbursement of confidential funds under both the Office of the Vice President and the Department of Education during Duterte's tenure as secretary.

The second article focuses on allegations of unexplained wealth and discrepancies involving Duterte's Statements of Assets, Liabilities and Net Worth and bank transactions flagged by the Anti-Money Laundering Council.

The third article concerns allegations of bribery tied to cash envelopes reportedly distributed to DepEd officials when Duterte was secretary.

The fourth article centers on Duterte's controversial remarks in November 2024 in which she publicly stated online that she had arranged for President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr., First Lady Liza Araneta-Marcos, and then-Speaker Ferdinand Martin Romualdez to be killed should anything happen to her.

The impeachment, which may highlight the end of the line, for the Vice President, deserves attention which underlines accountability in public office.

DASMARIÑAS CITY, Cavite (PIA) — The Commission on Elections (COMELEC) said it expects a swift proclamation of winners for the upcoming Dasmariñas Special Elections, with a new district representative proclaimed the morning after election day.

In a press briefing last June 11 following their first Coordination Meeting for the Special Elections, COMELEC chair George Garcia said he expects that the winning congressional candidate will be proclaimed on the morning of August 30.

“We intend to be able to proclaim the winning member of the House of Representatives the next morning, the morning after the elections of August 29. More or less on the morning of August 30, gusto na nating magawayon.”

Despite the limited preparations and election period, Garcia said they will be able to oversee the Special Elections which will be conducted manually.

Garcia admits that the Dasmariñas special elections will be conducted manually.

The special election follows the expulsion of former Representative Francisco “Kiko” Barzaga from the House of Representatives over repeated violations of chamber rules.

Senate President Alan Peter Cayetano on Tuesday raised concerns over reports that the National Bureau of Investigation (NBI) had informed only select senators of an alleged threat against the Senate, while also questioning why the warning surfaced at this particular time.

The issue arose after Senator Sherwin Gatchalian disclosed that some senators had been briefed by the NBI about a supposed threat to the institution, prompting heightened security measures within the Senate.

Cayetano said any credible threat against the Senate should have been relayed to all senators and coordinated through the Office of the Sergeant-at-Arms, which is responsible for the institution's security. “If the threat is credible, then every Senator, every member of the Secretariat, and every individual who works within these walls deserves to be informed and protected,” Cayetano said in a statement issued June 9. “Security is not the concern of one bloc. It is the concern of the entire Senate,” he added.

He questioned why the information was reportedly disclosed only to certain senators and not to the entire chamber. “The moment a ‘security threat’ is briefed to some and withheld from others, it ceases to be a security matter and becomes a political instrument,” he said. Cayetano also raised concerns about the

source of the reported intelligence. “It did not come from the Senate's own Office of the Sergeant-at-Arms, the office constitutionally charged with protecting this institution. It came from the NBI,” he said. He said the reported intelligence should first be verified before being accepted as fact and called for a clearer accounting of how the information was obtained and communicated. Questioning the timing of the disclosure Cayetano noted that it emerged as the Senate Blue Ribbon Committee continues its investigation into alleged irregularities in flood control projects. “The timing demands honesty. This ‘threat’ surfaces precisely as the testimonies made in the latest Blue Ribbon Committee hearing begin to press for answers from the names it has raised,” he said. The Senate President was referring to the June 4 hearing in which 18 former Marines testified and implicated several politicians in the alleged distribution of suitcases of cash. Despite the reported threat, Cayetano said the Senate should remain focused on its work. “Let there be no misunderstanding: the work of this Senate must continue. The surest test of whether a threat is genuine and not a pretext is simple – a real threat is used to protect the Senate's work, never to suspend it,” he said.

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SMC BRINGS RIVER CLEANUP PROGRAM TO CEBU TO HELP EASE FLOODING

San Miguel Corporation (SMC) launched its Butuanon River clean-up in Mandaue City, Cebu, expanding the company's long-running Better Rivers PH program in support of the government's Oplan Kontra Baha initiative.

The project will cover a four-kilometer section of the river from its mouth, where heavy siltation and waste buildup have restricted water flow to the Mactan Channel.

The Butuanon River was among the waterways that overflowed in November 2025 during Typhoon Tino, which brought more than a month's worth of rain and caused widespread flooding in Mandaue.

SMC Chairman and CEO Ramon S. Ang said the company will undertake the cleanup at no cost to the government, following the flooding experienced by residents.

"Mandaue has long been home to San Miguel and to generations of our employees, and we are glad to support the government in this effort to help reduce flooding and protect communities," Ang said.

SMC, which operates several major

facilities in Mandaue, is implementing the project in partnership with the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), which leads Oplan Kontra Baha, and the Mandaue City government.

Emmarie Ouano-Dizon, DPWH Undersecretary Charles Calima, other officials of DPWH and the Mandaue City government, and representatives from the Department of Environment and Natural

will be used to remove silt, waste and soil deposits that have reduced the river's capacity, based on initial assessments by SMC. The company said the Butuanon River has conditions similar to several heavily silted rivers it has previously cleaned. Its mouth has been blocked by silt and waste, limiting outflow to the Mactan Channel, while upstream soil deposits could eventually contribute to renewed blockage downstream if not removed.

Since 2020, SMC has removed nearly 9.2 million metric tons of silt and waste from more than 190 kilometers of river channels at no cost to government and taxpayers.

The work has covered the Tullahan, Pa-

sig, San Juan, Pampanga and Meycauayan rivers, as well as waterways in Bulacan, Laguna, Muntinlupa, Las Piñas and Parañaque. SMC has also continued maintenance cleanups in previously cleared waterways to help sustain their flood-carrying capacity.

"Our work in other rivers has shown that cleanup has to go beyond what people see on the surface. The important part is removing the buildup that has made the river narrower and shallower over time, so it can carry more water during heavy rains," Ang said. "With our facilities, people and equipment already in Mandaue, we wanted to put that experience to work in support of the city and its communities." PR

PhilHealthon YAKAP Provider Accreditation in Region 4A

This is to provide context to the reports regarding the accreditation of healthcare facilities under the jurisdiction of PhilHealth Regional Office IV-A (PRO IV-A).

The participation of providers under PRO IVA continues to grow. The number of facilities engaged in the program exceeds the small number that have stepped away. This year alone, 24 new facilities have been accredited, bringing the total number of YAKAP Clinics in PRO IVA to 298. In addition, nine facilities currently have pending applications and are completing accreditation requirements.

The reasons for disengagement are varied and the single case that cited non-payment was resolved following the provider's compliance with system related issues. The involved facilities each had distinct circumstances that led to their disengagement, most are rooted to their capacity to adhere to YAKAP's accreditation requirements.

PhilHealth continues to pay valid claims; complete and compliant claims are processed and paid accordingly. While we recognize that a novel program of this scale will encounter challenges as it expands, PhilHealth has established its system that resulted in a 98.74% payment rate for SAP1 nationwide. In the region,

payment is at 96.29% amounting to Php 122 million paid to YAKAP facilities as of June 8, 2026.

Similar scaling challenges were encountered in our inpatient benefit claims program. In response, PhilHealth strengthened its systems and significantly improved payment predictability, achieving a 10-day claims turnaround time. We are now applying these lessons learned to YAKAP and remain committed to continuously enhancing our systems, refining performance-based payment policies, and addressing the concerns raised by our partners.

However, these improvements depend on shared responsibility. We encourage our partner clinics to ensure that key requirements are in place, including a functioning certified EMR system, reliable internet connectivity, and completed Primary Care Unit (PCU) requirements. These measures help ensure smoother payment processing and uninterrupted services for patients. Most importantly, we want to reassure our members that their benefits remain available. Patients enrolled in affected facilities are being assisted in transferring to other accredited YAKAP providers to ensure continued access to consultations, preventive care services, and covered medicines without interruption.
